Tuition is \$350.00 for Chamber Members. We encourage a limit of one class member per business. Non-chamber members will be accepted only if space allows for an additional \$100.00. Chamber Bucks will be awarded at the end of the year to those with perfect attendance.

COMMITMENT

Leadership Washington hosts an integrated series of nine monthly sessions in different regions of the community. The program begins in September and runs through May (subject to change as we adjust to unexpected conflicts). Classes are the second Wednesday of the month from approximately 8am - 5pm. Topics cover the various industries present in our community and the tentative calendar can be found on the next page.
