Stephanie Heisdorffer with Hospice of Washington County presented a special event request by Zoom for the organization's annual 5k on September 25<sup>th</sup> from 6:30-11:30 a.m. Motion by Youngquist, seconded by Earnest, to approve the Hospice of Washington County special event request. Motion carried.

Librarian Jenisa Harrisa with Washington Public Library presented a special event request by Zoom for reading in Central Park on September 27 and October 18 at 4 p.m. Motion by Pettit-Majewski, seconded by Youngquist, to approve the Washington Public Library Reading in the Park special event request. Motion carried.

Presentation from the Public: WEDG Director Mary Audia presented information about a countywide childcare and workforce survey, a quarterly workforce initiative, and a monthly housing exploratory group. Bethany Glinsmann spoke in favor of smaller police departments and alternatives for officer staffing.

Motion by Pettit-Majewski, seconded by Youngquist, to approve a Resolution Adopting a Site Plan for Marion Avenue Baptist Church Multipurpose Center. Building and Zoning Administrator Jeff Duwa (via Zoom), and representatives of Marion Avenue Baptist Church answered questions about the project. Motion by Earnest, seconded by Stigers, to approve the Fiscal Year 21 City of Washington Financial Report. Motion carried.

Motion by Pettit-Majewski, seconded by Stigers, to approve Task Order No. 2045-21A (Old Wastewater Treatment Plant Demolition) for \$39,370 from FOX Engineering. Motion carried.

Motion by Stigers, seconded by Youngquist, to approve a Main Street Washington Challenge Grant Application Letter of Support for the Renovation of Winga's Café Building. Owners Isabella and Ed Santoro and Main Street Washington Director Sarah Grunewaldt answered questions via Zoom. Motion carried.

Motion by Pettit-Majewski, seconded by Youngquist, to approve a \$25,000 DIG Application for the Renovation of Winga's Café Building. Motion carried.

Motion by Earnest, seconded by Moore, to approve the Agreement with Iowa Association of Municipal Utilities for the Iowa Safety Education Program Participation Agreement. Motion carried.

The council went into workshop to discuss with possible action a sewer boring project with MSJ in the country club area. Mayor Rosien explained the use of American Rescue Plan Act funding being the preferred way to go. Developers Jeff Hazelett and Scott Goodwin answered council questions and explained they'd already discussed the project with engineer Jack Pope. Council spoke in favor of developing more housing.

Motion by Gault, seconded by Youngquist, to authorize the city to move forward with an engineer on the project and to use \$125,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funds for the sewer boring project. Motion carried.

The council went into workshop to discuss with possible action the city's cemetery hours and rules. Cemetery Sexton Nick Duvall presented the request of 48-hour notice for services year-round,

expanding the rule from the winter months. Gault said he preferred a 24-hour notice instead of 48 hours. Motion by Stigers, seconded by Pettit-Majewski, to approve a Resolution Adjusting Certain Fees and Regulations for City Cemeteries including requiring a 48-hour notice for interments with a \$300 charge for those that do not give prior notice with discretion of the Cemetery Sexton if accommodated during normal business hours, interments may not be held on Sunday sand city-recognized holidays, and said changes to go into effect October 1, 2021. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: Gault. Motion carried. (Resolution 2021-089)

The council went into workshop to discuss with possible action the Police Department Staffing Analysis. Police Chief Jim Lester gave a presentation explaining the department is currently at 11 full-time officers with the last increase about 25 years ago and requesting to add another officer as previously discussed. Chief Lester explained the Community Advisory Committee assisted in the Strategic Planning. Motion by Moore, seconded by Stigers, to begin the hiring process of one police officer. Motion carried.

# Department Activity August 2021

August was a very busy month with 521 calls for service. This included 49 animal calls (10 barking dogs, 10 bat calls and 9 animal bites). Officers also responded to 14 assault calls resulting in 12 incident reports and eight domestic assault calls resulting in six incident reports.

In addition, officers responded to more than 40 disorderly conduct and harassments complaints and recorded arrests on six no contact order violations.
