The Council of the City of Washington, Iowa, met in Regular Session in the Council Chambers, 215 East Washington Street on Tuesday, January 4, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. Mayor Rosien in the chair.

On roll call present: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Absent: none.

Motion by Gault, seconded by Youngquist, that the agenda for the Regular Session to be held at 6:00 p.m., Tuesday, January 4, 2022, be approved. Motion carried.

Claims for January 4, 2022, were presented by Finance Director Kelsey Brown.

Motion by Pettit-Majewski, seconded by Youngquist, to approve the claims for January 4, 2022. Motion carried.

Presentation from the Public: Lyn Thomas spoke of utility concerns and wanting the sidewalk on the north side of East Adams for the proposed East Adams Improvements Project. Sandra Pacha spoke of the sidewalk not being necessary for the proposed East Adams Improvements Project. Engineer Jack Pope answered questions about the proposed East Adams project design. Joe Redlinger asked about the payment schedule for assessments. City Attorney Kevin Olson said property owners can pay within 30 days of the project being accepted as final to pay without interest and after that payments can be collected with property taxes as has been previously done for assessed projects in the city over 10 years with interest.

Mayor Rosien announced that now is the time for public hearing on Amendment No. 2 to the Washington Unified South Central Residential Urban Renewal Plan.

No written or oral objections were received.

Motion by Earnest, seconded by Stigers, to close the public hearing. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Pettit-Majewski, seconded by Youngquist, to approve the Resolution Determining an Area of the City to be an Economic Development Area, and that the Rehabilitation, Conservation, Redevelopment, Development or a Combination Thereof, of Such Area is Necessary in the Interest of the Public Health, Safety or Welfare of the Residents of the City; Designating Such Area as

Appropriate for Urban Renewal Projects; and Adopting Amendment No. 2 to the Washington Unified South Central Residential Urban Renewal Plan. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: none. Motion carried. (Resolution 2022-001)

Mayor Rosien announced that no action is to be taken on the Public Hearing for Plans, Schedule, and Estimate of Cost on the East Adams Street Project and it will be on a future agenda.

Mayor Rosien announced that now is the time for public hearing on Proposed Ward Boundary Changes.

No written or oral objections were received.

Motion by Stigers, seconded by Youngquist, to close the public hearing. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Pettit-Majewski, seconded by Gault, to approve the First Reading of an Ordinance Amending the Ward Boundaries Within the City of Washington. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Youngquist, seconded by Stigers, to suspend the rules and hold the additional readings on ward boundary changes. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Pettit-Majewski, seconded by Youngquist, to approve the Second Reading of an Ordinance Amending the Ward Boundaries Within the City of Washington. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Youngquist, seconded by Pettit-Majewski, to approve the Third and Final Reading of an Ordinance Amending the Ward Boundaries Within the City of Washington. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: none. Motion carried. (Ordinance 1132)

Motion by Gault, seconded by Stigers, to approve a Resolution Approving and Authorizing Execution of an Extension Agreement by and Among the City of Washington, the County of Washington, and the Washington Community School District, Approving the Extension of a Division of Tax Revenue in the Washington Unified South Central Residential Urban Renewal Area. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: none. Motion carried. (Resolution 2022-002)

Motion by Gault, seconded by Pettit-Majewski, to approve a Resolution to Adopt the Final Assessment, Levy Assessment and Order Notice to be Sent to Affected Property Owners (South Avenue E). Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: none. Motion carried. (Resolution 2022-003)

Council discussed a Livestock in Town Request at 1105 North Iowa Avenue from Amanda Pickering to keep a goat. Pickering joined via Zoom and answered questions. After discussion, council had further questions. Motion by Earnest, seconded by Stigers, to table the request until the January 18, 2022, city council meeting. Roll call on the motion: Ayes: Gault, Earnest, Moore, Pettit-Majewski, Stigers, and Youngquist. Nays: none. Motion carried.

Motion by Youngquist, seconded by Pettit-Majewski, to approve splitting the \$38,943.99 funding source for Law Enforcement Technology Upgrade with half of the funding coming from American Rescue Plan Act funds and half from Local Option Sales Tax. Motion carried.

Motion by Youngquist, seconded by Gault, to approve a Letter of Agreement with Washington

County for Redistricting Wards. Motion carried.

Motion by Stigers, seconded by Pettit-Majewski, to approve an Election Precincts Agreement with Washington County Temporary Redistricting Commission. Motion carried.

Mayor Rosien provided an update on the upcoming Ward 1 City Council Vacancy at the end of the month. He explained council can decide to appoint or hold a special election.

Departmental reports were presented.

EMS continues to be busy with 87 calls for service in December. We continue to have response to every call with 2 or 3 people. This is excellent since we are a volunteer service. Washington Fire had 1 car fire in the month of December. It was a busy month for accidents and the weather that came through presented a few issues.

Washington Fire did not hold a monthly training in December due to the holidays. We will resume our monthly training schedule in February of 2022. We take 2 months off over the holidays so members can be with their families.

The storm that came through on December 15th cause a couple issues that we responded to, but nothing major to report. Washington Fire did get paged out for weather spotting due to high winds & the possibility of a tornado. I attended the department head meetings in December. I also met with the new owners of the former Crane building regarding fire code for their new business. Jerry Guengerich started his first day of full-time duties and Joe Redlinger's last day was 12/31/2021. We thank Joe for his years of service as a full-time driver.

Our calls for service were high for 2021. It was a record year. I am very proud of our group of volunteers! I will present more of a 2021 year in review at a future council meeting.

Elm Grove & Woodlawn Cemeteries

Council Report for December 2021

We had some storm damage from the wind on December 15, mostly sticks and branches, but did lose one tree at Elm Grove. I had 6 family requests for information this month. I have been working on updating cemetery records. I have also been working on budget for FY 2023. I have gotten snow removal equipment ready to go. I also have been helping with the shelter at Madison Park as my schedule allows.

The cemetery interments this year were above our 20-year average. The average for interments per year since 2002, has been 83.2. We had 96 interments this year, the largest number since 2002, when we had 101 interments. We also have seen a slight decrease in Saturday interments this year.

We had a huge jump in cremation interments in 2021, and many of them were carry overs from 2020. Covid-19 caused a lot of interments to be postponed. I would suggest that this is going to be the new normal for at least a few years. I have a list of interments (about 30 as of 1/1/2022) that I know about that haven't been scheduled yet. In 2001, the cremation interment rate was 11.7% and in 2018 that rate peaked at 45.1%, until 2021 where the cremation rate jumped to 59.4%. I would expect the cremation rate to hold steady around 45-50% for the near future. I have included a breakdown of the last 20 years, so that you may see how the rates have changed over the past 20 years. This rate is an important number because as the cremation rate continues to rise, the revenue that the cemetery generates will decrease.

We have had 7 funerals at Elm Grove this month, 96 in total for the year. In January, we plan to continue with funeral services, general cemetery cleanup, updating cemetery records, plowing snow as needed, and finish budget for FY 2023. Thank you.



The City of Washington has three requests for projects this year: Wellness Park Phase II (we have received municipal grant funds towards this project in FY16 for phase I, and FY20 and FY21 for Phase II), the Downtown Streetscape Expansion, and the Downtown Investment Grant Fund.

The requested \$55,000 for the Wellness Park Phase 2 would go towards the additional lighting needed at the soccer fields, two additional ball diamonds, and volleyball courts. This will allow tournaments to be played for longer hours, provide more outdoor recreational opportunities for multiple age and skill levels for multiple sports and helps beat the heat of the summer days.

The Downtown Streetscape Expansion is a project that we hope to begin in mid-2023. We requested and received \$175,000 of municipal grant funds for this project in FY21. We plan to request municipal grant funds for the next 3 fiscal years to save toward this project. The overall project goal is to "finish" the 2009 streetscape for the outlying blocks of the downtown core, which will actually be a much larger project than the original one. We estimate that the total funding needed for the project is \$6 million. We anticipate having most of this available through a general obligation bond backed by the Downtown TIF valuation, but anticipate the need for several supplementary funding sources, including but not limited to municipal grant funds, Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds, and Iowa Great Places funding. We are requesting \$270,000 toward this project this year.

The City wishes to use Municipal Grant funds to continue to partner with Main Street Washington to assist with the redevelopment of downtown buildings. The City has been granted \$228,500 in FY18/20. The funds are granted to downtown building owners with a minimum 3 to 1 match required with approval granted by the Main Street Design Committee for items including historically-appropriate design. To date, the program has leveraged a total of \$1.1 million in investment in our downtown. All of the money programmed by the WCRF to date has either been paid out or has been awarded but not yet disbursed for projects in progress.







A waiver on any one occasion shall not be construed as a bar to or waiver of any right and/or remedy on any future occasion.
- 5. Waiver of Protest. Each maker, surety endorser and guarantor of this Note, expressly waives presentment, protest, demand, notice of dishonor or default, and notice of any kind with respect to this Note.
- 6. Costs of Collection. The Maker will pay on demand all costs of collection, maintenance of collateral, legal expenses, and attorneys' fees incurred or paid by the





Kyler's emotional distress is such that he qualifies for an emotional support animal. In this case his goat, Honey.




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

Re: FY23 Budget Max Levy Hearing

Under the procedures adopted by the Iowa Legislature and signed by the Governor last year, we now have to have a "max levy hearing" in addition to our hearing prior to the formal adoption of the budget. Theoretically, if the proposed increase in the dollars levied is more than 2%, it takes a 2/3 supermajority of the Council to approve the resolution. However, since we have a 6-member Council, it always takes a 2/3 majority to pass any resolution. The proposed increase is 3.17% due to an expected increase in General Insurance of 10% and increased employee benefit costs (including health insurance and IPERS)

This resolution would set the max levy hearing for our February 1 regular meeting. The hearing and adoption of the final budget is expected to take place at our March 1 regular meeting.
