EMS calls were down in January. Only 63 this month. That has been our lowest amount so far to date since starting the service. We continue to get response to every call.

Washington Fire did not hold a monthly training in January due to Pancake Day. We will resume our monthly training schedule in February.

We had a report of a vehicle fire in January. The fire was out on arrival, we assisted in making sure it was complete put out. We had several vehicle accidents due to weather, several fire alarm/Carbon Monoxide detector calls in January as well. I attended the county fire chief's meeting on January 25th in Crawfordsville, as well as a meeting on the proposed railroad merger. I also worked on the FY23 proposed budget and attended a council meeting for any questions.

Pancake day was a success in early January. We served 2,257 people! This is the highest amount we have seen. We are working on possible improvements for next year, as our take outs were very high.

Full time staff continues to be busy responding to EMS & fire calls, fire inspections, and normal duties around the fire station.

Activity Report January 2022

As shown in the attached chart, January was an active month for the Police Department with investigations for assault, child endangerment and the execution of several search warrants.

The response and investigation of the shooting incident on January 7th was a demonstration of great teamwork and cooperation of local, regional, and state agencies. We also appreciated the quick response of the Maintenance and Construction crews in helping to secure the scene and to the Fire Department for the use of a bay to allow investigators to examine evidence in a warmer environment. The investigation continues and has resulted in the arrest of two persons for attempted murder and robbery.

Officer Aaron Kephart was sworn in by Mayor Rosien and began his duties on January 10th. After four weeks of Orientation and Field Training he has worked into the normal patrol officer rotation.

We received correspondence from the Iowa Department of Public Safety that we have satisfied certification requirements for the Iowa Uniform Crime Reporting program. This certification means that we have demonstrated compliance in our incident and arrest reporting by submitting data with 4% or less error rates for calendar year 2021. This was a frustrating process that required review and modification of most all 2021 incident reports and included some significant changes in our reporting practices.

Investigator VanWilligen and Chief Lester attended the Iowa Sex Crimes Investigators Association conference and the entire department participated in Question-Persuade-Refer suicide awareness training presented by the Washington County Iowa State Extension Office during our monthly staff meeting.

Water Plant Operations: I submitted Decembers MORs to the DNR. I Submitted Annual Water Usage Report to the DNR. We have been working on the dead meter list along with replacing a few frozen meters. We have been doing extra meter reading while Elaine is out. We collected routine monthly bacteria samples; results were absent. We changed bag filters and RO 1 cartridge filters. Our bulk chemicals were delivered and filled up. We collected our monthly well levels. I wrote a thank you letter to IRWA for there services. This is how they get funding, so we were happy to write something up for them. IRWA is a great resource for us and all small communities in Iowa. We are a region hub for IRWA and store equipment for small communities to use. Renewed memberships to IRWA and AWWA. Worked on budget.

Operators: I am approved to take my Grade III Water Distribution exam, and am waiting to hear back from the DNR to schedule a date to take it. 





These Supplementary Conditions amend or supplement the Division 1 - General Provisions and Covenants of the SUDAS Standard Specifications and other provisions of the Contract Documents as indicated below. All provisions which are not so amended or supplemented remain in full force and effect.

The terms used in these Supplementary Conditions will have the meanings indicated in the General Provisions and Covenants. Additional terms used in the Supplementary Conditions have the meanings indicated below, which are applicable to both the singular and plural thereof.

SECTION 1010 - DEFINITIONS

Section 1.03 Definitions and Terms.

The term "Jurisdiction" as it is used throughout the contract documents shall mean "The City of Washington, Iowa". The term "Engineer" shall mean "Garden & Associates, Ltd. of Oskaloosa, Iowa".

SECTION 1020 - PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS

Add the following new paragraph immediately following paragraph 1.04 E:

"F. No drawings or physical testing of conditions in or relating to existing surface or subsurface structures or conditions have been utilized by the ENGINEER in the preparation of the Drawings and Specifications. It is the CONTRACTOR's responsibility to become familiar with and satisfied as too local and site conditions that may affect cost, progress, performance and finishing of the work."

Section 1020 - 1.08 A, Sales Tax Exemption Certificate shall apply to this project. The Jurisdiction will issue sales tax exemption certificates to contractors and subcontractors, allowing them to purchase, or withdraw from inventory, materials for the contract free from sales tax pursuant to Iowa Code Sections 423.2 and 423.45.

SECTION 1050 - CONTROL OF WORK

In Section 1050, following paragraph 1.01 D., add the following:

- "E. Engineer will make visits to the Site at intervals appropriate to the various stages of construction as Engineer deems necessary in order to observe as an experienced and qualified design professional the progress that has been made and the quality of the various aspects of Contractor's executed Work. Based on information obtained during such visits and observations, Engineer, for the benefit of Jurisdiction, will determine, in general, if the Work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents. Engineer will not be required to make exhaustive or continuous inspections on the Site to check the quality or quantity of the Work. Engineer's efforts will be directed toward providing for Jurisdiction a greater degree of confidence that the completed Work will conform generally to the Contract Documents. On the basis of such visits and observations, Engineer will keep Jurisdiction informed of the progress of the Work and will endeavor to guard Jurisdiction against defective Work.
- F. If Jurisdiction and Engineer have agreed that Engineer will furnish an authorized representative to represent Engineer at the Site and assist Engineer in observing the progress and quality of the Work, then the authority and responsibilities of any such authorized representative will be as provided in the Supplementary Conditions, and limitations on the responsibilities thereof will be as provided in Section 1050 1.01 E. above. If Jurisdiction designates another representative or agent to represent Jurisdiction at the Site who is not Engineer's consultant, agent, or employee, the responsibilities and authority and limitations thereon of such other individual or entity will be as provided in the Supplementary Conditions.
- G. Neither Engineer's authority or responsibility under this Section or under any other provision of the Contract, nor any decision made by Engineer in good faith either to exercise or not exercise such authority or responsibility or the undertaking, exercise, or performance of any authority or responsibility by Engineer, shall create, impose, or give rise to any duty in contract, tort, or otherwise owed by Engineer to Contractor, any Subcontractor, any Supplier, any other individual or entity, or to any surety for or employee or agent of any of them.
- H. Engineer will not be responsible for the acts or omissions of Contractor or of any Subcontractor, any Supplier, or of any other individual or entity performing any of the Work.
- I. The limitations upon authority and responsibility set forth in this Section 1050 1.01 E. above shall also apply to the authorized representative, if any."

In Section 1050, following paragraph 1.05 A.2., add the following:

- "3. Number of copies of submittals required: 5.
- 4. Each submittal shall bear a stamp or specific written certification that Contractor has satisfied Contractor's obligations under the Contract Documents with respect to Contractor's review of that submittal, and that Contractor approves the submittal.
- 5. With each submittal, Contractor shall give Engineer specific written notice of any variations that the Shop Drawing or Sample may have from the requirements of the Contract Documents. This notice shall be set forth in a written communication separate from the Shop Drawings or Sample submittal; and, in addition, in the case of Shop Drawings by a specific notation made on each Shop Drawing submitted to Engineer for review and approval of each such variation."

In Section 1050, delete paragraph 1.05 C. in its entirety and add the following:

"C. Engineer's Review:

- 1. Engineer will provide timely review of Shop Drawings and Samples in accordance with the Schedule of Submittals acceptable to Engineer. Engineer's review and approval will be only to determine if the items covered by the submittals will, after installation or incorporation in the Work, conform to the information given in the Contract Documents and be compatible with the design concept of the completed Project as a functioning whole as indicated by the Contract Documents.
- 2. Engineer's review and approval will not extend to means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction or to safety precautions or programs incident thereto.
- 3. Engineer's review and approval of a separate item as such will not indicate approval of the assembly in which the item functions.
- 4. Engineer's review and approval of a Shop Drawing or Sample shall not relieve Contractor from responsibility for any variation from the requirements of the Contract Documents unless Engineer has given written approval of each such variation by specific written notation thereof incorporated in or accompanying the Shop Drawing or Sample.
- 5. Engineer's review and approval of a Shop Drawing or Sample, or of a variation from the requirements of the Contract Documents, shall not, under any circumstances, change the Contract Times or Contract Price, unless such changes are included in a Change Order.
- 6. Neither Engineer's receipt, review, acceptance or approval of a Shop Drawing, Sample, or other submittal shall result in such item becoming a Contract Document.

7. Contractor shall perform the Work in compliance with the requirements and commitments set forth in approved Shop Drawings and Samples, subject to the provisions of Paragraph 1.05 C.4. above."

SECTION 1070 - LEGAL RELATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITY TO THE PUBLIC

In paragraphs 3.02, C., 2., g., amend by adding the following in bold text:

"g. The policy shall not contain a total or absolute pollution exclusion. Coverage shall be provided for pollution exposures arising from products and completed operations, 3rd party injury, and property damage claims including clean-up costs for pollution. This policy shall be maintained for not less than three years after final completion."

In paragraphs 3.02, C., 5., amend by adding the following in bold text:

"5. Umbrella/Excess Insurance: At the Contractor's option, the limits specified in Section 1070, 3.02, C, 1, 2, 3 may be satisfied with a combination of primary and Umbrella/Excess Insurance. At the Jurisdiction's option, the minimum insurance limits specified above may be increased by special provision. This increase may be satisfied with a combination of primary and Umbrella/Excess Insurance. The Umbrella/Excess policy shall follow the form of each underlying policy."

In paragraphs 3.02, C., 6., a. and b., amend by adding the following in bold text:

- "a. Include the Jurisdiction and Engineer as an additional insured, per Section 1070, 3.06, B; and
- b. Be primary to and not in excess of or contributory with any other insurance available to the Jurisdiction and Engineer."

In paragraph 3.03, B., amend by adding the following in bold text:

"B. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Jurisdiction and its officers, agents, employees, and consultants and the Engineer and its officers, agents, employees, and consultants from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including but not limited to, attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance or prosecution of the work by the Contractor, its subcontractors, agents, or employees; or arising from any neglect, default, or mismanagement or omissions by the Contractor, its subcontractors or consultants, suppliers, third parties, or the agents, officers, or employees of any of them in the performance of any duties imposed by the contract or by law; provided any such claim, damage, loss, or expense:"

In paragraph 3.03, E., amend by adding the following in bold text:

"E. If any litigation on account of such claims shall be commenced against the Jurisdiction or Engineer, the Contractor, upon notice thereof from the Jurisdiction, or Engineer shall defend the same at its sole cost and expense; and the record of any judgment rendered against the Jurisdiction or Engineer on account of such claims for damages shall be conclusive as against said Contractor and entitle the Jurisdiction or Engineer to recover the full amount thereof, with interest and cost, and attorney's fees incurred by said Jurisdiction or Engineer, whether the Jurisdiction or Engineer paid such amounts or not."

In paragraph 3.06, A., amend by adding the following in bold text:

"A. All liability insurance policies the Contractor is required to provide pursuant to this Section 1070, Part 3 - Bonds and Insurance shall be by endorsement name and designate the Jurisdiction and Engineer as an additional insured."

In paragraph 3.06, B., amend by adding the following in bold text and remove the stricken:

"B. The Additional Insured Endorsement shall include the following provisions:

The Jurisdiction and Engineer, including all its their elected and appointed officials, all its employees and volunteers, all its boards, commissions and/or authorities and their board members, employees, and volunteers, and all its officers, agents, and consultants, are named as Additional Insureds with respect to liability arising out of the Contractor's work and services performed for the Jurisdiction. This coverage shall be primary to the Additional Insureds, and not contributing with waiver of subrogation with any other insurance or similar protection available to the Additional Insureds, whether other available coverage by primary, contributing, or excess.

The Additional Insured Endorsement shall be included on all Commercial General Liability, Automobile Liability, and Umbrella/Excess Insurance policies."

In paragraph 3.07, A., amend by adding the following in bold text:

"A. The Contractor shall, prior to the Jurisdiction's approval and execution of the Contract, provide to the Jurisdiction and Engineer a certificate or certificates of insurance evidencing all required insurance coverages as required in this Section 1070, Part 3 – Bonds and Insurance, utilizing the ACORD certificate form, or equivalent, required by the Jurisdiction. The Certificate of Insurance requirement may be satisfied with a blanket certificate."

In paragraph 3.08, A., amend by adding the following in bold text:

"A. Upon the occurrence of any event, the liability for which is herein assumed by the Contractor, the Contractor agrees to forthwith notify the Jurisdiction and Engineer in writing of such happening, which notice shall give the details as to the happening, the cause as far as can be ascertained, the estimate of loss or damage done, the names of witnesses, if any, and stating the amount of any claim."

The bid submitted by DeLong Construction, Inc. was \$5,750 below (3.3%) the Engineer's opinion of probably construction cost. A bid tabulation is enclosed for your reference.

FOX Strand contacted DeLong Construction, Inc. to discuss their bid and construction schedule. DeLong Construction believes their bid is reasonable and has found no errors. ADOPTING AND IMPLEMENTING A BUY LOCAL POLICY AND LOCAL BIDDER PREFERENCE POLICY FOR THE CITY OF WASHINGTON, IOWA

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 23A.3 allows Iowa cities to adopt polices that give preference to the purchase of goods and services to locally owned businesses located within the city where the costs are relatively equal; and,

WHEREAS, such preference to local businesses perpetuates the community by patronizing those who make up the local community and directly supports their taxes and purchase of other local community services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WASHINGTON, IOWA, as follows:

Section I. That the City of Washington shall adopt and implement the following Buy Local Policy and require its officials and employees to purchase supplies and materials from businesses in the City of Washington as long as such purchases do not impose unacceptable cost on the general tax payer and/or exceed 5% of the cost of similar items and supplies from out-of-town businesses.

Section II. That the City of Washington shall adopt and implement the following Local Bidder Preference Policy and award competitive bids to local bidders where goods and services are relatively equal and the local bidders' price is within the following range:

Bid Amount Under \$10,000 Under \$1,000,000 \$1,000,000 or Over Percent of Difference 5% with a Maximum of \$500 2% with a Maximum of \$20,000 Maximum of \$20,000

Section III. A local business shall be defined as any business that owns or leases a building or premises in the city limits of Washington, Iowa, employees a minimum of two employees, and uses the building/premise to conduct actual business operations.

Section IV. In determining that total purchase price, the official or employee shall include all incidental costs to the purchase, such as shipping, installation, setup and etc. The official or employee shall also have the discretion to make purchases in contrary to this resolution/policy when extenuating circumstances require.

ANIMAL SHELTER AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into by and between the City of Washington, Iowa, an Iowa municipal corporation, 215 E. Washington Street, Washington, Iowa 52353, hereafter referred to as the "City"; and the Washington County Humane Society (d/b/a PAWS & More Animal Shelter), an Iowa nonprofit corporation, 1004 ½ W. Madison Street, Washington, Iowa 52353, hereafter referred to as "PAWS."

WHEREAS, PAWS runs a nonprofit animal shelter (the "Services") in the City of Washington whose goal is to promote the adoption of stray animals in the City and surrounding areas; and

WHEREAS, the City has heretofore used PAWS for the sheltering of stray cats and dogs and budgeted an annual amount to fund a portion of the Services provided by PAWS; and

WHEREAS, the City and PAWS wish to enter into a multi-year agreement setting the terms of these services using PAWS standard fees.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- A. Obligations of PAWS. As a material term of this Agreement, PAWS will provide the following Services to the City, subject to the payment provisions in Section B of this Agreement:
- 1. <u>Stray Cats</u>. PAWS shall retrieve as needed, and house all stray cats under the jurisdiction of the City that are brought to the animal shelter operated by PAWS, including all cats brought to the animal shelter by any employee or agent of the City. All care of the cats housed at the animal shelter shall be at the sole cost and expense of PAWS.
- 2. <u>Stray Dogs.</u> After the City holds any unclaimed stray dogs for a period of seven (7) days as required by the City ordinances and policies at the City's dog pound, City shall deliver said animals to PAWS at a mutually agreeable time, to be housed at the sole cost and expense of PAWS pending adopting out of the animal.
- 3. <u>Trap. Neuter and Release services.</u> PAWS, on an as-needed basis to be arranged with the City or as requested by the City, shall conduct a program in the City to capture cats and sterilize said animals before releasing these animals back into the community.
- 4. <u>Operation of the Shelter</u>. By entering into this Agreement, PAWS agrees that it will be responsible for compliance with the City's ordinances regarding the sound of barking

dogs. In the event that the City receives complaints from neighboring properties, PAWS shall correct said noise violations in a timely manner.

- 5. <u>State regulations.</u> PAWS agrees to operate the animal shelter and provide the Services to the City in strict compliance with all state laws and regulations regarding the operation of an animal shelter.
- 6. <u>Reporting.</u> PAWS agrees to provide a verbal report to the City Council at least once per year, along with written reports during the year as merited.
- 7. <u>Invoices.</u> PAWS agrees to provide an annual invoice in July of each year for the previous calendar year for the actual services performed.
- 8. <u>City Official as Voting Board Member.</u> As a term of this Agreement, PAWS agrees to designate an elected or appointed City official as a voting member of its board of directors, and to maintain a voting City representative throughout the duration of this Agreement.
- 9. <u>Notification of Changes in Service Fees.</u> PAWS agrees to notify the City by January 15 of any fee changes that are to go in effect for the following City fiscal year.
- **B.** Obligations of the City. As material terms of this Agreement, the City will provide the following to PAWS:
- 1. <u>Fees for Service</u>. In consideration of the Services PAWS provides to the City under Section (A)(l) of this Agreement, the City shall pay fees to the shelter on the following schedule:
 - a. Fiscal Year 2023 Boarding: Actual cats x \$20.00 boarding fee x 7 days/animal
 Pick Ups: Actual cats picked up x \$70 fee/animal
 Dogs: Actual dogs x \$105.40/animal
 - b. Fiscal Year 2024 Continuation of payment of PAWS standard rates
 - c. Fiscal Year 2025 Continuation of payment of PAWS standard rates

- 2. Payment for stray dogs. In exchange for taking the City's stray dogs after the initial seven (7) day holding period, the City will pay to PAWS, the sum of \$105.40 per dog retrieved by PAWS from the City within 30 days of invoice of PAWS. This fee is the typical cost of humanely euthanizing a dog by the City. Notwithstanding this program, at its sole discretion and cost, the City will euthanize any stray dogs that are a danger to the public as a result of the dog's temperament or health.
- 3. Payment for Trap. Neuter and Release services. As payment for PAWS conducting the trap, neuter and release services described in Section (A)(3) above, the City will pay to PAWS, within 30 days of invoice to the City, the sum of \$70 per animal sterilized. This fee is the typical cost of this program per animal. This amount will not exceed \$2,000 in a fiscal year unless agreed upon in advance by the City and PAWS.
- 4. <u>Voluntary donation on utility bills.</u> At the request of a City utility customer, the City shall place a voluntary donation charge of up to five dollars (\$5) per month on that customer's bill, in possible increments of \$1, \$2 or \$5 per month, with all such collections to be paid by the City to PAWS on a monthly basis. Donations may be terminated by utility customers at anytime.

C. Administrative Provisions.

- 1. <u>Term of Agreement</u>. This Agreement will commence as of midnight on July 1, 2022 and will continue until 11:59 p.m. on June 30, 2025. Unless terminated by either party via written notice to the other party by April 1, 2025, the Agreement will continue on a year-to-year basis using PAWS standard fees as the basis for payment, and under the notification provision detailed in Section A(8) of this agreement for any fee changes.
- 2. <u>Default.</u> In the event that either party has defaulted on its obligations of the Agreement, the other party shall give the defaulting party notice of said default and give the other party fifteen (15) days to remedy said default. In the event that the default is not cured within said fifteen (15) day period, the nondefaulting party may terminate this Agreement and seek to recover damages, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, caused by said breach.
- 3. <u>Notices.</u> For purposes of this Agreement, when notice is required to the other party, notice is deemed given when the party has sent written notice, via regular U.S. Mail, with appropriate postage attached and placed in a mail box for delivery, to the following:

For the City:

- 4. <u>Survival</u>. All express representations, indemnifications or limitations of liability made in or given in this Agreement shall survive the completion of the services to by rendered by PAWS and the City hereunder or the termination of this Agreement for any reason.
- 5. <u>Controlling law.</u> This Agreement is to be governed by the laws of the State of Iowa. The parties hereto agree that any action, suit or proceeding based upon any matter, claim or controversy arising under this Agreement shall be brought solely in the state courts located in Washington County, Iowa or the federal courts located in Linn County, Iowa. The parties hereto hereby irrevocably waive objection to the venue of the above-mentioned courts, including any claim that such action, suit or proceeding has been brought in an inconvenient forum. Both parties hereto expressly acknowledge and agree that nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to require the parties to submit to mandatory arbitration or mediation in the event of a breach or dispute hereunder.
- 6. <u>Headings</u>. The headings of sections of this Agreement are for convenient reference only and shall not be deemed to limit, construe, affect, modify or alter the meaning of such sections.
- 7. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, term or provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to PAWS, the City or a particular circumstance shall, to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of said section, subsection, term or provision of this Agreement or the application of same to the PAWS, the City or particular circumstances other than that for which it was held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby and each remaining section, subsection, term or provision of this Agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 8. <u>Modification.</u> The terms of this Agreement may not be changed, waived, discharged or terminated orally, but only by a written document signed by the party against whom enforcement of the change, waiver, discharge or termination is sought.

- 9. <u>Waiver.</u> No waiver by the City or PAWS of any default hereunder shall operate as a waiver of any other default or of the same default on any future occasion. No delay on the part of the City or PAWS in exercising any right or remedy hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof. No single or partial exercise of any right or remedy by the City or PAWS shall preclude future exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right or remedy.
- 10. <u>Authority</u>. The persons signing this Agreement warrant and represent that they have the authority to sign as, or on behalf of, the party for whom they are signing.
- Final Agreement. Both PAWS and the City hereby expressly acknowledge and agree that this Agreement is intended to set forth the entire agreement between the parties regarding the services to be rendered by the PAWS to the City in connection with the Services, that there are no other considerations or monies contingent upon or resulting from the execution of this Agreement, and that no other monies or considerations have been solicited. No waiver, change, modification or amendment of this Agreement shall be binding upon either party hereto unless inwriting and signed by both PAWS and the City. The waiver by either party hereto of a breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach of that provision or of any other provision or condition in this Agreement.

As was discussed last fall, we have an upcoming project with the Washington County Engineer on a joint road improvement project on West 5th Street. In September, council approved a Resolution to enter a 28E for this improvement project and now is the time to award the project. The work includes an overlay west from Avenue D, repouring driveway entrances, and shoulder work.

The lowest bid was for \$969,707.77 from Jones Contracting Corp. of West Point, Iowa.

The following Resolution will award the contract for the project and authorize Washington County Engineer Jacob Thorius to sign the contract documents for the project.
