As part of our Joint record management system with the Washington PD, Washington County Communications, and the Washington County Sheriff's Office it was time to replace our outdated RMS data storage server. We had replaced the application server earlier in 2021 and now have completed the update of the entire system by updating the data storage portion.

Included are 4 invoices from CDW-G. Half of each invoice is the cost of a server for Jailtracker. The Sheriff's Office pays this, and it is \$14, 467.00

The remaining half of each invoice is for the server used to hold and preserve data for TAC10. With the completion of replacing this data server, TAC10 should be good to go for 3-5 years.

The half remaining should be split in a 1/3 for payment between the Sheriff's Office, County Communications and Washington PD. This is the same as the APP server replaced early 2021.

Re: Reprecincting Ordinance

The State has reviewed the documents submitted for reprecincting and recommends some changes to our ordinance. Those corrections are reflected in the attached ordinance, which must include the word "Precinct" when describing the different wards and one block was not adequately described in the written ordinance. The map that was approved by council previously is not changing.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE DIVIDING THE CITY OF WASHINGTON INTO WARDS.

WHEREAS, the United States Census Bureau completed the 2020 Census and provided those results to the State of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the State of Iowa passed and approved the new federal and state legislative districts on October 6, 2021; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 49 of the Code of Iowa, the City must complete establish new precinct boundaries within 60 days of the passage of the federal and state legislative districts; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk, at the Council's direction has drafted a ward boundary map that requires approval of the City Council.

WHEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Amendment.</u> Chapter 3 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Washington is hereby amended by deleting the chapter in its entirety and replacing it with the following:
- **"3.01 DIVISION INTO WARDS.** The City of Washington is divided into four wards as follows:
- 1. First Ward Precinct One. The First Ward consists of the area bounded on the west and north by the Washington city limits; the south by W. Main Street east to South H Avenue; thence south to W. Washington Street; thence south to W. Jefferson Street; thence east to S. 4th Avenue and bounded on the east by S. 4th Avenue; thence north to E. 5th Street; thence west to N. 2nd Avenue; thence north to W. 17th Street; thence west to N. Marion Avenue; thence north to 18th Street.
- 2. Second Ward Precinct Two. The Second Ward is bounded on the north and east by the Washington city limits; bounded on the west by S. 4th Avenue north to E. 5th Street; thence west to N. 2nd Avenue; thence north to W. 17th Street; thence west to N. Marion Avenue; thence north to 18th Street and bounded on the south by E. Washington Street from the S. 4th Avenue east to northeast corner of Washington County Parcel No. 1116400026.
- 3. Third Ward Precinct Three. The Third Ward consists of the area bounded on the east and south by the Washington city limits; bounded on the west by S. 4th Avenue south to E. Monroe Street; thence west of S. 3rd Avenue; thence south to E. Polk Street; thence west to S. Iowa Avenue; thence south to the city limits; and bounded on the north by E. Washington Street from the S. 4th Avenue east to northeast corner of Washington County Parcel No. 1116400026.
- 4. Fourth Ward Precinct Four. The Fourth Ward consists of the area bounded on the west and south by the Washington City limits; the north by W. Main Street east to S. H Avenue; thence south to W. Washington Street; thence south to W. Jefferson Street; thence east to S. 4th Avenue; and bounded on the east by S. 4th Avenue south to E. Madison Street; thence west of S.

 3^{rd} Avenue; thence south to E. Polk Street; thence west to S. Iowa Avenue; thence south to the city limits."

- 2. <u>Conflicts.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances not specifically provided for and in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- 3. <u>Adjudication</u>. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- 4. <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
