# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF WASHINGTON, IOWA, CHAPTER 52 "GRASS AND WEEDS"

Section 1. <u>Amend Paragraph.</u> Section 52.07 is amended by deleting the following wording "Upon failure to comply with such abatement notice, an administrative fee of \$50 will be assessed to the property owner in addition to abatement costs."

Section 2. <u>Repealer</u>. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the foregoing provisions are hereby repealed.

Section 3. <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF WASHINGTON, IOWA, CHAPTER 53 "SNOW AND ICE"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Washington, Iowa, that the Code of Ordinances of the City of Washington, Iowa, is hereby amended as follows:

- Section 1. <u>Amend Paragraph.</u> Section 53.01 is amended by adding after "or ice has formed." the wording "This chapter shall not relieve the owner and/or occupant from any and all liability for injuries or damages occurring as a result of the snow and/or ice accumulation on the sidewalk, nor shall this chapter render the city liable to a person, persons, firm or corporation for damages as result of injuries occurring upon the sidewalk."
- Section 2. <u>Amend Paragraph.</u> Section 53.04 is amended by deleting the paragraph titled "**RESPONSIBILITY AND LIABILITY.**
- Section 3. <u>Amend Paragraph.</u> Section 53.04 is amended by adding a new paragraph as follows: **NOTICE TO ABATE NUISANCE.** Whenever a snow and ice nuisance exists upon any property, a City official may serve notice upon the owner, owner's agent, or occupant of the property to abate the nuisance within forty-eight (48) hours or within a stated longer period if the City official determines it necessary to avoid undue hardship. Such notice shall be made by one of the following methods: personal contact by phone or in person, posting a notice in a conspicuous place upon the premises where the nuisance exist, U.S. certified mail, or regular U.S. mail service.
- Section 4. <u>Amend Paragraph.</u> Section 53.06, delete the words "with a second notice", and replace with "such notice".
- Section 5. <u>Repealer</u>. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the foregoing provisions are hereby repealed.
- Section 6. <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
