- Lexington lift station alarms On June 20<sup>th</sup> Jason got a call from David Bloch of Electric Pump (EP). David had Jason switch a couple of the pump wires to see if pump #1 would send a pump #1 not in auto alarm. We received a pump #1 not in auto shortly after that even though pump #1 was running and pumping. What this told David was it wasn't a problem with the Omni Site alarm it was a Primex control problem. David sent an email to Primex to make them aware it was their problem and not EP's. Scott of Primex was here on the 29<sup>th</sup> to troubleshoot the control panel. Scott thinks there was a bad relay causing the not in auto alarms. He replaced the bad relay and said to monitor it for a couple days to see if that corrects it.
- Parkside Estates lift station I received three (3) callouts at this lift station on the 18<sup>th</sup>. The vacuum pump that primes the big pump was having issues. On the 20<sup>th</sup> Jason and I replaced the vacuum pump with a used one we had on hand. On the 22<sup>nd</sup> I found the vacuum pump had developed a hole in its airline causing it to run nonstop during my morning rounds. Highway Service Center fabricated a new air line for us out of a brake line to get us by. We ordered a new vacuum pump from Smith/Loveless to replace the used one. The used one will be saved as a backup.
- USEPA blind laboratory performance evaluation audit samples Jason performed the tests on the audit samples. I submitted our test results for the lab performance evaluation. We should know how we did sometime in July.
- Maintenance on WWTP equipment We changed the oil and greased SBR blowers #2 and #3. SCADA controls indicated it was time to do this.

## **Southeast Basin Sanitary Sewer Evaluation**

#### **Project Update**



The intent of this update is to give an overview of the project status to date and what may be completed in the coming month. It is intended to be a general overview and tentative in nature.

#### Work Completed from May - June

- FOX received additional manhole observation information.
- FOX continued with mapping of the SE basin based on information provided.
- FOX provided additional comments and clarification items to the city regarding manholes and pipes in the SE basin.
- FOX had a meeting with city staff to review the project and to determine data collection that was remaining by the city.
- The City provided additional information on clarification items.
- FOX provided the city a map indicating pipe segments in which FOX has not received televising information.

#### What to Expect in July

- FOX will receive additional clarification items and will update the sanitary sewer mapping.
- FOX will complete a field survey to collect the remaining information to complete the basin mapping.
- FOX will complete the SE basin mapping after the field survey is completed.
- The city will provide the remaining televising videos to FOX for review of critical pipe sections.
- FOX will continue with modeling efforts of the SE basin after the mapping is completed.

#### **Information Needed**

- Manhole information that will be collected by FOX survey crew.
- Remaining televising data.
- Information from the city on past sanitary sewer projects completed in the SE Basin.

#### **Schedule Impacts**

Here is one quote for a power washer, they are out of Kalona. I spoke with Nelson Yutzy from Helmuth Repair yesterday as he examined our wash bay area and the old power washer. The 4 gpm unit in the quote is highly recommended and our water volume in the wash bay exceeds double the demand needed for this unit. This would run off of diesel fuel instead of kerosene, diesel fuel lubricates the pump components a lot more than kerosene. Which our old washer ran off of kerosene. It is a portable unit but will be stationed in the wash bay most of the time. The wand handle has a pivot point at the hose connection and directly below the trigger. A hose real is a necessity especially in the winter months to leave the unit sit inside the heated room and not pulling it out all the time. The unit will fit in a 30 inch door frame, which our frame is a 32 or 36. Zach can wash engines with this washer by turning the heat all the way up and adjusting the regulator down from 4 gpm to 2 gpm to virtually steam clean.

RESOLUTION APPROVING A DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF WASHINGTON AND ACH FOAM TECHNOLOGIES, INC.

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2014, the City Council of the City of Washington adopted Amendment No. 2 to the Washington Unified Commercial Urban Renewal Plan (the "Urban Renewal Plan") and designated that area as an Economic Development Area pursuant to Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that properties located within said Urban Renewal Areas be redeveloped as part of the plan for overall development covered by this Urban Renewal Plan; and

WHEREAS, ACH Foam Technologies, Inc., hereafter referred to as "ACH" and the City have negotiated a Development Agreement whereby the City would grant to ACH the sum of not-to-exceed \$12,000.00 as an economic development grant to construct stormwater improvements on its property at 809 East 15<sup>th</sup> Street, in the Urban Renewal Area (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, Chapters 15A and 403 of the Iowa Code authorizes cities to make loans and grants for economic development in furtherance of the objectives of an urban renewal project and to appropriate such funds and make such expenditures as may be necessary to carry out the objectives of the urban renewal project and Chapters 15A and 403 of the Code of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has heretofore determined that entering into the Development Agreement with ACH is in the best interests of the citizens of the City and said Project is in furtherance of the goals and objectives of the Urban Renewal Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Washington, Iowa, finds that:

Section 1. That the performance by the City of its obligations under the Development Agreement, including the making of an economic development grant to ACH under the terms set forth in said Development Agreement is hereby declared by this City Council to be a public purpose and undertaking in furtherance of the goals and objectives of the Urban Renewal Plan.

Section 2. That the performance of the obligations by the City under this Agreement, will:

- a. Assist in the generation of businesses that add diversity and generate new opportunities for the Iowa economy.
- b. That the obligations under this Agreement in dispensing said economic development grant will produce public benefits and gains which benefits and gains are warranted based upon the amount of the economic development grant dispensed to ACH.

<u>Section 3.</u> That the aforementioned Development Agreement be and the same is hereby approved. Further, the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby directed to execute said Development Agreement on behalf of the City.

#### DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

THIS DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") entered into on this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2016, by and between the City of Washington, Iowa, a municipal corporation, (the "City"); and ACH Foam Technologies, Inc., a Colorado corporation (the "Developer").

#### **RECITALS:**

- 1. The Developer is the owner of certain real property legally described on Exhibit "A" attached to this Agreement and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Development Property").
- 2. The Development Property is located within the Washington Unified Commercial Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area"), which is an economic development area pursuant to Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa.
- 3. The Developer desires to construct stormwater improvements on the Development Property (the "Urban Renewal Project") in accordance with the objectives of the Washington Unified Commercial Urban Renewal Plan (the "Urban Renewal Plan).
- 4. Chapters 15A and 403 of the Code of Iowa authorize cities to provide grants, loans, guarantees, tax incentives and other financial assistance to or for the benefit of private persons.
- 5. The Developer has requested and the City has agreed to provide the Developer an economic development grant (the "Economic Development Grant") in an amount not-to-exceed \$12,000 under the terms and conditions described below.

IN CONSIDERATION of the premises and the mutual obligations of the parties hereto, each party to this Agreement of them does hereby covenant and agree with the other as follows:

#### A. <u>Covenants and Obligations of the Developer.</u>

- 1. The Developer expressly agrees to operate the Urban Renewal Project on the Development Property for a period of not less than five (5) years from this date in accordance with the objectives of the Urban Renewal Plan.
- 2. The Developer shall cause the Urban Renewal Project to be maintained in a clean and safe manner.
- 3. The Developer agrees to maintain full-time employment of at least \_\_\_\_\_ full-time equivalent employees in Washington, and continue to operate the plant as a going concern for not less than five (5) years from this date.



4. The Developer agrees to provide a certification of work completed on the Urban Renewal Project, in a form acceptable to the City.

#### B. <u>City Obligations.</u>

- 1. Upon completion of the Urban Renewal Project, inspection by the City and receipt of a certification of work by the Developer, the City shall make a one-time payment of not-to-exceed \$12,000, based on actual project costs, with the City to be repaid from incremental taxes at a later date.
- C. <u>Reimbursement of Costs by the Developer</u>. As part of this Agreement, any eligible legal or administrative expenses incurred by the City shall be reimbursed from incremental tax revenues, and the Developer will not be responsible for directly reimbursing any such costs.

#### D. Administrative Provisions.

- 1. This Agreement may not be amended or assigned by either party without the express permission of the other party. However, the City hereby gives its permission that the Developer's rights to receive the TIF Payments hereunder may be assigned by the Developer to a lender, as security, without further action on the part of the City.
- 2. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties.
- 3. This Agreement shall be deemed to be a contract made under the laws of the State of Iowa and for all purposes shall be governed by and construed in accordance with laws of the State of Iowa.

The City and the Developer have caused this Agreement to be signed in their names and on their behalf by their duly authorized officers, all as of the day and date written above.

Re: Redevelopment of Old Calendar Factory and Goncho Apartments

We have been working with a developer over the past year on the possible redevelopment of two disused buildings in the central area of Washington. The developer, Hobart Historic Restoration, LLC of Cedar Rapids, has submitted offers to purchase on the Old Calendar Factory (628 East Third Street) and Goncho Apartments (306 North Marion Avenue). The developer needs the Council's support of applications for each building for the Brownfield/Grayfield tax credit program. Coupled with state and federal historic tax credits, this program would help to make the buildings more feasible for redevelopment, which is expected to cost in the millions for each project. These resolutions are nearly identical (with only updated valuation numbers) to the resolutions the City Council approved last year at this time.

The Council previously established intent to grant a 10-year, 100% TIF rebate for each project. This will be finalized at a later time by the consideration of formal development agreements.

Redevelopment of these properties would be a tremendous win for our community. We are still a long way off, and this will not be a quick process in any event. I greatly appreciate the seriousness and the expertise that has been evidenced by our interactions thus far with Hobart Historic Restoration. I have no doubts that if all of the necessary pieces fall into place, that they will be able to deliver on getting these projects completed.

- B. The property is believed to contain significant lead paint and asbestos hazards.
- C. The property is currently 100% vacant, and has been since approximately 1960, and is in a blighted condition.
- D. While it is not known how far the property's assessed value has declined from its peak, the building is currently valued at just \$4,700, or \$0.27 per square foot, far below a typical assessment for commercial property.

Section 2. The City Council supports the Developer's application for Brownfield/Grayfield tax credits through the Iowa Economic Development Authority.

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes the importance of redevelopment of a vacant and distressed property located at 306 North Marion Avenue in Washington, known locally as Goncho Apartments; and

WHEREAS, Hobart Historic Restoration, LLC ("the Developer") wishes to redevelop this property for use as apartments; and

WHEREAS, to this end, the Developer plans to apply for Brownfield/Grayfield tax credits through the Iowa Economic Development Authority:

Section 1. The City Council believes that the property located at 306 North Marion Avenue is appropriate for Brownfield/Grayfield tax credits, under applicable statutes and administrative rules, including Iowa Code Chapter 15.291. This finding is made for the following reasons:

- A. The property may be considered a "brownfield" due to potentially significant asbestos and lead paint hazards, as well as past methamphetamine contamination (2013).
- B. The property may be considered a "grayfield" as:
  - a. The property has been vacant since January 2013 and is in blighted condition.
  - b. The assessed value of the building has declined from \$133,500 to \$42,500 in the past three years.

Section 2. The City Council supports the Developer's application for Brownfield/Grayfield tax credits through the Iowa Economic Development Authority.

#### A RESOLUTION SETTING A GENERAL FUND BALANCE POLICY AND AUTHORIZING INTERFUND TRANSFERS

WHEREAS, the City is in the process of planning for building projects including new/improved space for Police, Fire, Development Services and Finance/Administration departments ("the Municipal Building projects"); and

WHEREAS, it is the goal of the City Council to finance these improvements with funds on hand to the greatest degree possible, and minimizing the amount needed to be borrowed to make the necessary improvements; and

WHEREAS, the financial performance of the City's General Fund has exceeded projections in the past several years; and

WHEREAS, the City Council would both like to meet the project funding goal listed above as well as establish a policy for General Fund balance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WASHINGTON, IOWA:

Section 1. The City Council hereby establishes that the fiscal year-end fund balance for General Fund 001 will be capped at \$1,000,000, or 25% of annual General Fund revenues, whichever is more.

Section 2. The City Council hereby establishes legislative intent that until the Municipal Building projects are complete, any amount in excess of \$1,000,000 at fiscal year-end will be transferred to Municipal Building Fund 309. This practice will be initiated with FY2016 closeout.

Section 3. This City Council establishes intent to revisit this policy upon completion of the Municipal Building projects.

Section 4. All Resolutions or parts of Resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict.
