### Water Dept.

The high flows at the water plant have finally subsided. The M&C Dept was able to located a large leak on the 400 block of E. Harrison St. on Tuesday, the 13th. Once it was repaired, our distribution flow dropped by 300,000 gallons a day. Thanks to JJ and his crew for finding and fixing the leak.

With the leak fixed, the new water tower went into service on September 21<sup>st</sup>. So far everything has worked out very well and we have experienced no issues with the transition.

The old tower was demolished on September 28<sup>th</sup>. The crew came around 6:00 am and had everything torn down and cleaned up by 5:00 pm. I have not been given a date yet as to when the excavating crew will be here to dig up the foundations and remove the lead contaminated dirt. However, they will definitely be here before the ground freezes.

We have had some issues with EDR 3 over the last few weeks; the PLC has crashed twice. We had to replace the entire rack along with one of the input cards. We did the same repair on EDR 2 the month prior. These are 24-year-old units and the PLC is essentially the computer that runs them so it's not unexpected for us to have these kinds of issues.

### **Traffic/Street Lighting**

We've replaced a few bulbs at the intersection of 2<sup>nd</sup> and Main along with a street light at Timber Ridge.

I informed Joe Marie about a downtown cobra-head light that needs repaired.

### WWTP report October 4, 2016 Council meeting

- After hour alarm and dog call outs 17<sup>th</sup> dog call, Safety Center reported a dog to be picked up Van Buren & S 13<sup>th</sup>, 2:34 p.m. Parker 18<sup>th</sup> WWTP & Lexington lift station, generators running, 5:03 p.m. Fred 22<sup>nd</sup> WWTP, elevated TSS alarm, 4:00 a.m. Fred 22<sup>nd</sup> dog call, Safety Center reported dog to be picked up at Stairway to the Stars,10:00 p.m. Parker 28<sup>th</sup> dog call, Public reported a dog to be picked in the 1200 Blk W Main, 7:00 p.m. Parker
- **Dept Head meetings** I attended the meetings on the 20<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup>.
- Saturday mornings We will be open on Saturday mornings from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. on the following dates: October 22<sup>nd</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> /November 5<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, & 19<sup>th</sup> so Washington residents can bring out their yard waste and tree trimmings.
- Parker Parker has finished being vaccinated with the pre-rabies vaccine in case he gets bitten by a rabid animal. He received the second shot on September 22<sup>nd</sup> and the third on the 29<sup>th</sup>. Parker will also be attending the thirty (30) hour basic waste water training class in Ankeny at DMACC on October 3, 4, 10, and 11<sup>th</sup>. Parker plans to take his State of Iowa grade I waste water exam sometime after completing the thirty (30) hour class.
- Treated bio-solids sample We collected a bio-solids sample for IDNR 503 regs. The sample was sent to Test America for analysis on the 20<sup>th</sup>. This testing is required before the bio-solids can be land applied this fall. We also are required to collect seven (7) fecal coliform samples over a two (2) week period. These samples are taken to University Hygienic Lab (UHL) at the Oakdale Campus since they have an eight (8) hour holding time and require analysis within that time frame.
- Big live dog trap Jason and Parker set up the big live trap at 831 East Madison to catch a pitbull
  that was loose and couldn't be caught. The dog was caught and transported to the pound on
  September 23<sup>rd</sup>.
- Iowa Pump Works (IPW) IPW was in town on the 29<sup>th</sup> to install the repaired East EQ pump and remove the second pump to be taken back to their shop for repair estimates. They also removed the north pump at the Underpass lift station. This pump is very old. During the pump service agreement work IPW determined it needed to be replaced soon since parts are obsolete. We had a pump from the old WWTP that will be used as a replacement. IPW took the used pump back to their shop to make sure it was good to go. It checked out fine.

# <u>September City Council Update – Parks Department</u>

- We tore off and re-shingled the roof on the small garden shed near the cabin and painted the exterior.
- We have several maintenance items completed at the pool. We are nearly complete with re-grouting of tiles in the swim lanes. We have winterized the portions of the pool we are able to do and will assist ACCO is blowing out the rest of the lines for winterization in the next couple weeks.
- The fountain will be drained the first week of October, we are going to leave it running for homecoming festivities taking place on Friday.
- Assisted with several events at Central Park including car shows, craft fair, concert, and farmers markets.
- Fertilized grass at Central Park and soccer fields. The soccer fields look much better.
- Re seeding the grass in front of the bandstand at Central park has gone well. The grass is up and growing well. We will need to keep the snow fence up this fall and winter and remove it in the spring.
- Attended two Parks Board meetings and Department head meetings.
- We are busy keeping up with mowing, trimming and spraying at all our locations.
- We removed a tree at the water plant to make it easier for deliveries.
- Submitted a grant for Central park fountain light upgrades to the WCRF.
- We were successful in receiving a grant for Disc golf course improvements from the Washington area betterment foundation.

# **Maintenance and Construction Report**

### 9/10/16-9/23/16

STREETS: M/C Personnel poured 3 yards of concrete in 4 locations of sidewalk repair due to previous excavations. Personnel trimmed trees and chipped them around town, making visibility conditions better at intersections and keeping the height above the curb and sidewalks as in the ordinance.

WATER DISTRIBUTION: M/C Personnel repaired the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> water main breaks this year. They were located at North 8<sup>th</sup> Ave-East 10<sup>th</sup> St (4 inch CIP) & South Iowa-Sitler (6 inch CIP). Crews repaired a leaking water box at 415 West Jefferson St. Personnel disconnected the water service at 521 North Ave D for demo purposes.

SEWER COLLECTION: M/C Personnel repaired a sewer main in front of the Halcyon House that was damaged from boring the new 8 inch water service. Personnel also jetted the same sewer main and flushed it as well using 6,000 gallons of water. Personnel continued to flush the terminal manholes and trouble spots using an additional 14,000 gallons of water. Personnel capped the sewer service at 521 North Ave D for demo purposes. Personnel plugged a cross connection between the sanitary and storm sewers at South 13<sup>th</sup> Ave-East Harrison St.

### STORM SEWER COLLECTION: M/C Personnel N/A

MECHANIC/SHOP: M/C Personnel installed spare leaf box in #111, PD 79 (water pump), 301 (rear brakes/wheel seals), serviced PD 96 loaded street sweeper for Trans Iowa to repair.

OTHER: M/C Personnel responded to 62 One Call Locates. Crews hauled more than a dozen loads of concrete south of town. The brush pile and bags at the WWTP were ground and hauled away to a farm south of town.



Re: Parkside Estates Request

As the Council is aware, we have been discussing with Parkside Estates a very high water bill they received for some time now. Looking back, it is still hard to believe this has been in process for over 3 months. It is necessary to get a conclusion to this issue, and it is my understanding that representatives from Parkside Estates will be present at the meeting. They claim that no leaks occurred on their property, so we have not been able to come to any form of agreement, and I thus cannot offer any staff recommendation for forgiveness of any portion of the bill. Their normal bill is around \$3,000, and July 1, they received a bill for \$22,000.

I have attached narrative from Chad and Kyle related to their dealings with this situation, and we will have all of the appropriate staff members present to assist you in decision-making.





I spoke with Mark from Parkside Estates on June 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2016 regarding the amount of the water bill. He was insistent that there were no leaks of any kind that would be the cause of a \$22,000 water bill. He acknowledged that the water meter had been read since he received the bill and that the meter reading appeared to be back to normal compared to previous usage.

We spoke about his park manager, Butch, telling Asst. Water Supt. Kyle Wellington about how there were several trailers leaking water from broken meters this last spring. Mark claimed that that was from two years ago. That struck me as odd considering that he did not own the park at that point and why would Butch be telling Kyle about something that happened two years ago.

Mark continued to push me for answers as to why the water bill was so high. I explained to him that there was no way for me to know where the water went. All I could confirm was that the meter reading was correct therefore the water did indeed flow through the meter. He insisted that something must be wrong with the meter. I explained to him why that was not possible. I also pointed out that the meter was reading normal then there was a high reading but then it was back to reading normal. There is no way that the meter could randomly malfunction and then heal itself like that. Plus, if the meter malfunctioned, it wouldn't work at all. There is no way for a water meter to randomly speed up.

In the end, there was not much I could say to please Mark. I explained to him that my family owns several trailer parks themselves and some of them are on municipal water sources so I definitely understood his frustration and could empathize more than most. That being said, I explained to him that I did not have the authority to do anything with regards to reducing his water bill. I further explained that Parkside Estates has had many issues over the years with water leaks and maintenance problems. As far as I was able to gather, he planned to appeal to the City Administrator.

Re: West 3<sup>rd</sup> Storm Sewer Project

We budgeted the West 3<sup>rd</sup> Storm Sewer project as an in-house project in this fiscal year. Because we have run into some delays to the Country Club Road project due to the need to work out some additional details on the sewer, we would like to proceed with the West 3<sup>rd</sup> project. Hopefully this project can be knocked out quickly, and then by that time we will be able to turn our attention to the Country Club Road project.

The purpose of the West 3<sup>rd</sup> project is to provide additional capacity to the storm sewer in the area between Avenue C and St. James Church in order to relieve the flash flooding we experience at the intersection of 3<sup>rd</sup> and Marion near Fareway in major storms.

The storm sewer project should be relatively straightforward, and is well below budget. However, we would like the Council to consider the possibility of an additional sidewalk component to the project while we are working in the area. I have attached some photos to assist your consideration of adding these improvements, but here are the 3 options we have identified for sidewalk:

- Option 1: Construct approximately 95' of new sidewalk to connect the sidewalk along the south side of West 3<sup>rd</sup> to the St. James parking lot. Currently the sidewalk terminates in the middle of the lot of the house at 525 West 3<sup>rd</sup> Street. As this is a significant collector street and a walking path to the St. James School, it seems strange that the sidewalk terminates like this.
- Option 2: Construct Option 1 plus replace an additional 160' of sidewalk in poor condition that is only around 30" wide.

• Option 3: Construct Option 2 plus replace an additional 140' of sidewalk in relatively poor condition back to Avenue D.

JJ is working on cost estimates for the sidewalk options, and will have this by meeting time. I would recommend doing at least Option 1 due to its benefits for sidewalk connectivity. Options 2 and 3 would probably make things significantly more complicated and the project somewhat more time consuming, but may be justifiable if you want to ensure decent sidewalk on that block. We haven't usually torn up much more sidewalk on our projects than is strictly needed for a specific excavation, except for replacing ADA ramps.

In any event, we would like your permission at a minimum to proceed with the storm sewer improvements. We have made contact with St. James already, and would plan to schedule a meeting with affected property owners as soon as possible to discuss the project and answer any questions. Ideally, we might be able to get things done within a couple weeks of breaking ground.



- ♦ "Closing" shall mean the date of delivery of the Note to the Original Purchaser and the funding of the Interim Loan;
- ♦ "Corporate Seal" shall mean the official seal of Issuer adopted by the Governing Body;
- ♦ "Fiscal Year" shall mean the twelve months' period beginning on July 1 of each year and ending on the last day of June of the following year, or any other consecutive twelve-month period adopted by the Governing Body or by law as the official accounting period of the System; provided, that the requirements of a fiscal year as expressed in this Resolution shall exclude any payment of principal or interest falling due on the first day of the succeeding fiscal year;
- ♦ "Governing Body" shall mean the Council of the City, or its successor in function with respect to the operation and control of the System;
- ♦ "Interim Loan" shall mean the principal amount allocated by the Original Purchaser and loaned to the City under the Program, equal in amount to the principal amount of the Note;

- ♦ "Note" shall mean \$507,000 Water Revenue Capital Loan Notes Anticipation Project Note, Series 2016, authorized to be issued by this Resolution;
- ♦ "Original Purchaser" shall mean the Iowa Finance Authority, as the purchaser of the Note from Issuer at the time of its original issuance;

♦ "Paying Agent" shall be the Finance Director, or such successor as may be approved by Issuer as provided herein and who shall carry out the duties prescribed herein as Issuer's agent to provide for the payment of principal of and interest on the Notes as the same shall become due;

#### • "Permitted Investments" shall mean:

- direct obligations of (including obligations issued or held in book entry form on the books of) the Department of the Treasury of the United States of America;
- cash (insured at all times by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or otherwise collateralized with obligations described in the above paragraph);
- obligations of any of the following federal agencies which obligations represent full faith and credit of the United States of America, including:
  - Export Import Bank
  - Farm Credit System Financial Assistance Corporation
  - USDA Rural Development
  - General Services Administration
  - U.S. Maritime Administration
  - Small Business Administration
  - Government National Mortgage Association (GNMA)
  - U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (PHA's)
  - Federal Housing Administration
- repurchase agreements whose underlying collateral consists of the investments set out above if the Issuer takes delivery of the collateral either directly or through an authorized custodian. Repurchase agreements do not include reverse repurchase agreements;
- senior debt obligations rated "AAA" by Standard & Poor's Corporation (S&P) or "Aaa" by Moody's Investors Service Inc. (Moody's) issued by the Federal National Mortgage Association or the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation;
- U.S. dollar denominated deposit accounts, federal funds and banker's acceptances with domestic commercial banks which have a rating on their short-term certificates of deposit on the date of purchase of "A-1" or "A-1+" by S&P or "P-1" by Moody's and maturing no more than 360 days after the date

of purchase (ratings on holding companies are not considered as the rating of the bank);

- commercial paper which is rated at the time of purchase in the single highest classification, "A-1+" by S&P or "P-1" by Moody's and which matures not more than 270 days after the date of purchase;

- pre-refunded Municipal Obligations, defined as any bonds or other obligations of any state of the United States of America or of any agency, instrumentality or local governmental unit of any such state which are not callable at the option of the obligor prior to maturity or as to which irrevocable instructions have been given by the obligor to call on the date specified in the notice; and (a) which are rated, based on an irrevocable escrow account or fund (the "escrow"), in the highest rating category of S&P or Moody's or any successors thereto; or (b)(i) which are fully secured as to principal and interest and redemption premium, if any, by an escrow consisting only of cash or direct obligations of the Department of the Treasury of the United States of America, which escrow may be applied only to the payment of such principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on such bonds or other obligations on the maturity date or dates thereof or the specified redemption date or dates pursuant to such irrevocable instructions, as appropriate; and (ii) which escrow is sufficient, as verified by a nationally recognized independent certified public accountant, to pay principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bonds or other obligations described in this paragraph on the maturity date or dates specified in the irrevocable instructions referred to above, as appropriate;
- tax exempt bonds as defined and permitted by section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code and applicable regulations and only if rated within the two highest classifications as established by at least one of the standard rating services approved by the superintendent of banking by rule adopted pursuant to chapter 17A Code of Iowa;
- an investment contract rated within the two highest classifications as established by at least one of the standard rating services approved by the superintendent of banking by rule adopted pursuant to chapter 17A Code of Iowa; and
  - Iowa Public Agency Investment Trust.
- ♦ "Program" shall mean the Iowa Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Program undertaken by the Original Purchaser;

- ♦ "Project" shall mean the costs of acquisition, construction, reconstruction, extending, remodeling, improving, repairing and equipping of the System;
- ♦ "Project Costs" shall mean all engineering fees, archeological surveys, environmental studies, and fees related to a project plan preparation and submission, and other expenses incidental thereto, and also including the costs of issuance of the Note.
- ♦ "Project Fund" shall mean the Project Fund established by Section 6 of this Resolution.
- ♦ "Registrar" shall be the Finance Director, or such successor as may be approved by Issuer as provided herein and who shall carry out the duties prescribed herein with respect to maintaining a register of the owners of the Note. Unless otherwise specified, the Registrar shall also act as Transfer Agent for the Note;
- ♦ "System" shall mean the municipal water utility of the Issuer and all properties of every nature hereinafter owned by the Issuer comprising part of or used as a part of the System, including all water treatment facilities, storage facilities, pumping stations and all related property and improvements and extensions made by Issuer while the Note remains outstanding; all real and personal property; and all appurtenances, contracts, leases, franchises and other intangibles;
- ♦ "Treasurer" shall mean the Finance Director or such other officer as shall succeed to the same duties and responsibilities with respect to the recording and payment of the Note issued hereunder.

Section 2. <u>Authority</u>. The Agreement and the Note authorized by this Resolution shall be issued pursuant to Section 76.13 of the Code of Iowa, and in compliance with all applicable provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of Iowa. The Agreement shall be substantially in the form attached to this Resolution and is authorized to be executed and issued on behalf of the Issuer by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

#### Section 3. Note Details, Execution, Redemption and Registration.

- a. Note Details. The Note shall be designated a Water Revenue Capital Loan Notes Anticipation Project Note, be dated the date of delivery, in the denomination of \$1,000 or multiples thereof, and shall at the request of the Original Purchaser be initially issued as a single Note in the denomination of \$507,000 and numbered R-1. The Note shall not bear interest (0%), and shall mature three years from issuance. The City Council hereby finds and determines that it is necessary and advisable to issue said Note pursuant to Section 76.13 of the Code of Iowa, as authorized by the Agreement and this Resolution.
- b. <u>Execution</u>. The Note shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signature of the Mayor and attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Clerk, and impressed or imprinted with the seal of the City and shall be fully registered as to

both principal and interest as provided in this Resolution; principal, interest and premium, if any, shall be payable at the office of the Paying Agent by mailing of a check, wire transfer or automated clearing house system transfer to the registered owner of the Note.

c. <u>Redemption</u>. The Note may be called for redemption by the Issuer and paid before maturity on any date, from any funds regardless of source, in whole or from time to time in part, in order of maturity and within an annual maturity by lot.

Notice of redemption shall be given by U.S. mail to the Original Purchaser (or any other registered owner of the Note). The terms of redemption shall be par, plus accrued interest to date of call. Failure to give such notice by mail to any registered owner or any defect therein shall not affect the validity of any proceedings for the redemption of the Note. The Note is also subject to mandatory redemption to the extent not fully drawn upon.

d. Registration. The Note may be registered as to principal and interest on the books of the Note Registrar in the name of the holder and such registration noted on the Note after which no transfer shall be valid until the making of an entry upon the books kept for the registration and transfer of ownership of the Note, and in no other way. The Finance Director is hereby appointed as Note Registrar under the terms of this Resolution. Registrar shall maintain the books of the Issuer for the registration of ownership of the Note for the payment of principal of and interest on the Note as provided in this Resolution. The Note shall be negotiable as provided in Article 8 of the Uniform Commercial Code subject to the provisions for registration and transfer contained in the Note and in this Resolution.

Section 5. <u>Security for Note</u>. The Note shall be payable solely from the Project Fund. To pay the principal on the Note when it becomes due, there is hereby created a pledge of the receipts anticipated in said Project Fund to continue until the payment in full of the principal on the Note.

Section 6. <u>Establishment of Project Fund</u>. The Issuer hereby creates and establishes a Project Fund, into which Project Fund are hereby appropriated the following:

Proceeds of not to exceed \$507,000 Water Revenue Capital Loan Notes, additional action on the issuance of which previously has been taken and approved by the City Council.

In the packet are the following documents:

- 1) Resolution approving final plat. There should not be any major surprises here. This resolution also includes the dedication document, which officially designates the streets described in the final plat as city streets. The only changes from previous discussion are:
  - a. V&K changed the lot numbering, so the lot numbers are all different as follows:

- b. We have enlarged the easement area for the welcome sign (see new Lot 10). We wanted to make sure there was some flexibility for grading and landscaping around the proposed sign.

- 3) Resolution setting hearing to dispose of property through purchase agreement with WEDG (hearing to take place October 18)

#### PROTECTIVE COVENANTS AND RESTRICTIONS

The undersigned, the City of Washington, Iowa, being the owner of the following premises in the City of Washington, Washington County, Iowa, to wit:

Lots 2-11, Washington Business Park Subdivision, Phase One, Washington, Iowa;

(the "Property")

for the mutual benefit of those persons who may purchase any of the Property now owned by the undersigned, hereby imposes the following covenants and restrictions on said Property as covenants running with the land, and with such force and effect as if contained in each subsequent conveyance of land.

- A. <u>Permitted Uses.</u> The use of the Property shall be limited to the Permitted Principal Uses in the I-1 Light Industrial District and I-2 General Industrial District zoning districts of the Washington Code of Ordinances, <u>excepting therefrom the following uses:</u>
  - 1. Adult establishments pursuant to Chapter 132 of the Washington Code of Ordinances.
  - 2. Auto salvage and wrecking operations, industrial metal and waste salvage operations, and junk yards.
  - 3. Mini-storage projects, that being rentals of storage of personal belongings which are not used as part of a business or trade.
  - 4. Personal storage facilities, that being occupation of any property of the Property for storage of the owner's personal belongings.
- B. <u>Residential Use prohibited.</u> No portion of any of the Property shall be used for residential lots and there shall be no building or trailer located on any of the Property for residential purposes.
- C. <u>Accessory Uses.</u> The Accessory uses incidental to the Permitted Uses in the Washington Zoning Ordinance are allowable.
- D. <u>Parking Areas, Driveways and Loading Zones.</u> All parking, storage and driveway/drive aisles shall be constructed of asphalt or Portland concrete.
- E. <u>Signs.</u> All signs shall be monument-style signs, no pole signs are allowed.

- F. <u>No subdivision allowed.</u> No lot purchased in said subdivision shall be further subdivided by any owner of record.
- G. Repurchase Authorized. If the owner of any lot in this subdivision purchased its portion of the Property from the City of Washington, and no permanent structure has been constructed has been constructed within two (2) years from the date of recording of the deed for the conveyance of the portion of the Property, the City of Washington may repurchase said portion of Property by providing sixty (60) days' written notice to the owner at the address listed in the records of the Washington County Auditor or its intention to repurchase. - H. <u>Tax Exempt Properties; payment in lieu of taxes.</u> No portion of the Property shall be occupied by a tax exempt use unless the owner/tenant on any portion of the Property has entered into an agreement for payment in lieu of taxes.
- I. <u>Effective Period.</u> These covenants are to run with the land and shall be binding on all parties and all persons claiming under them for a period of twenty (20) years at which times said covenants shall cease unless these covenants are extended by a 75% vote of the owners of the Property.
- I. <u>Default.</u> If the parties hereto or any of them or their heirs or assigns shall violate, or attempt to violate any of the covenants set out herein during the time the covenants are still if effect, it shall be lawful for any other person or persons owning any other area in said Property to prosecute any proceeding at law or in equity against the person or persons violating or attempting to violate said covenants or restrictions and either prevent them from doing so or recover damages for said violation.

#### **PURCHASE AGREEMENT**

THIS PURCHASE AGREEMENT entered into by and between the City of Washington, Iowa, 215 E. Washington Street, Washington, Iowa 52353 (hereafter the "Seller"); and Washington Economic Development Group, 205 W. Main Street, Washington, Iowa 52353 (hereinafter the "Buyer").

1.	<b>REAL ESTATE DESCRIPTION.</b> The Seller agrees to sell and the Buyer agrees to purchase the following described properties in the City of Washington, Washington County, Iowa:
	Lots 1-10, Washington Business Park, Phase I, according to the plat thereof recorded in Book at page, Records of the Washington County Recorder.
	These parcels shall hereafter be collectively referred to as the "Property."

2. PURCHASE PRICE. The purchase price of each lot of the Property shall be as follows:

Lot 1: \$100,000 Lot 2: \$30,000 Lot 3: \$25,000 Lot 4: \$25,000 Lot 5: \$35,000 Lot 6: \$30,000 Lot 7: \$130,000 Lot 8: \$85,000 Lot 9: \$75,000 Lot 10: \$90,000

3. **DATE OF POSSESSION/CLOSING.** The Buyer have the right to market and sell the Property for a period of ten (10) years from the date of this Agreement. The Seller shall give possession of the Property, or any portion thereof, on the same date that the Buyer closes on the Property, or any portion thereof, with a permitted user of the Property.

- 4. **LIMITATIONS ON SALE.** Buyer expressly agrees and understands that the City has invested in the City's Business Park for the purpose of expanding the tax base and creating jobs. Therefore, Buyer expressly agrees that it shall not sell or attempt to sell any portion of the Property to any business that is tax exempt unless first obtaining the necessary further approvals of the City, said approval only to be given in its sole discretion. Because of the impacts upon neighboring properties, the Buyer is also prohibiting from selling any portion of the Property for an adult entertainment establishment.
- 4. **REAL ESTATE TAXES.** Seller shall pay any unpaid real estate taxes payable in prior years and any and all real estate taxes and utilities that accrue during the term of this Agreement.
- 5. **RISK OF LOSS AND INSURANCE.** Seller shall bear the risk of loss or damage to the Property prior to the date of possession. Buyer may, at his sole cost and expense, maintain insurance on the Property, but is not obliged to do so. The Seller shall maintain liability insurance only on the Property during the term of this Agreement.
- 6. **USE OF PURCHASE PRICE.** At the time of closing, the Buyer shall pay, without setoff, all the remaining monies due to the Seller after deducting the payments referenced in Paragraph 15 below.
- 7. **ABSTRACT AND TITLE.** Seller shall promptly obtain an abstract of title to the Property continued through the date of acceptance of an Offer produced by the Buyer to sell any portion of the Property to a permitted user, and deliver it to Buyer for examination. Thereafter, this contract may be foreclosed in equity and the Court may appoint a receiver.

- b. If Seller fails to timely perform this contract, Buyer shall have the right to have all payments made returned to them.
- c. Seller and Buyer also are entitled to utilize any and all other remedies or actions at law or in equity available to them and shall be entitled to obtain a judgment for costs and attorneys fees as permitted by law.
- 11. **CONTRACT BINDING ON SUCCESSORS IN INTEREST.** This contract shall apply to and bind the successors in interest of the parties.
- 12. **ASSIGNMENT.** Either party may assign this Purchase Agreement by giving written notice of said assignment to the other party.
- 13. **CONSTRUCTION.** Words and phrased shall be construed as in the singular or plural number, and as masculine, feminine or neuter gender, according to the context.
- 14. **CERTIFICATION.** Seller and Buyer each certify that they are not acting, directly or indirectly, for or on behalf of any person, group, entity or nation named by any Executive Order of the United States Treasury Department as a terrorist, "Specially Designated National and Blocked Person" or any other banned or blocked person, entity, nation or transaction pursuant to any law, order, rule or regulation that is enforced or administered by the Office of Foreign Assets Control; and are not engaged in this transaction, directly or indirectly on behalf of, any such person, group, entity or nation. Each party hereby agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other party from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, risks, liabilities and expenses (including attorney's fees and costs) arising from or related to a breach of the foregoing certification.
- 15. **CREDITS FROM PURCHASE PRICE ALLOWABLE.** The Buyer shall be allowed to deduct from the Purchase Price listed in Paragraph 2 above, or another price approved by the Washington City Council, the costs to include, but not be limited to, the costs of any real estate commissions, recording fees, transfer taxes and 6% of the final purchase price as payment for marketing the Property on behalf of the City.
- 16. **TIME OF ACCEPTANCE.** The Seller shall have until 5:00 p.m. on November 30, 2016 to accept this Offer by the City or this Agreement shall become null and void.
