They are great instructors provided by the Iowa Fire Service Training Bureau at no charge. We also got to demonstrate some new battery powered extrication tools, in hopes of securing some in the future for our new engine.

I attended numerous staff meetings and fire meetings and an EMS Advisory council discussion. This will be a huge benefit if EMS is deemed an essential service in Washington County. If it passes – discussions will begin on how to utilize those funds. Full-time staff continue to be busy responding to EMS & fire calls, fire inspections, and normal duties around the fire station. We plan to burn down the Barthalow farmhouse on October 23rd in the evening. I met with the Asbestos inspector and am in the process of getting everything submitted to the Iowa DNR for approval.

Overall, August was a quiet month, as expected. A lot of our members are on vacation during August with their families, prior to school starting.

WATER DISTRIBUTION: Personnel repaired number 8,9, 10 & 11 water main breaks of 2024, located at 1600 block of North 3rd Ave, 1200 block of North Iowa Ave and two on West Harrison St between Iowa and Marion. Personnel shut off 11 water services for nonpayment.

SEWER COLLECTION: Personnel installed the 6 inch sewer service for the Soccer field concession at the Wellness Park. Personnel flushed 2,000 gallons of water in the sanitary sewer off of West Buchanan St. Televised in Highland Ct on sewer issues from a resident's request.

STORM SEWER COLLECTION: Personnel checked on a couple of minor issues.

MECHANIC/SHOP: Personnel serviced #111 (wiring issues, changed air lines on bottom of valve and replaced plow lights), #117 (welded on box corner headache rack), PD 713, #144 tank truck (new water pump and temp gauge), PD 852, street sweeper (replaced grease zerk on gutter broom), #305 (rotated tires, installed steering shock and took to Mincer for tranny re-program), FD Engine #1 (changed tarp on hose bed), #630 BackHoe (installed glass window-bottom right front), replaced two LED bay lights and portable air compressor (changed battery).

OTHER: Personnel hauled numerous loads of spoil away. Also hauled a few loads of rock back to the storage building. Personnel responded to 83 One Call locates. The yard waste program continued.

Water Treatment Plant: August 2024 Council Report

Here is a summary of the updates and activities from the Water Treatment Department for August of 2024.

Water Plant Operations: I submitted our July MOR to the DNR. We read water meters, book 7, our extra monthly meter list, all unread meters, and re-reads. We changed 9 water meters in August. We continue to work on changing meters that are not reading. We continue to record LSLI(lead service line inventory) as we are changing meters. Will started logging in the LSLI into the DNR Database. Our goal is to submit it by the end of September, well before the Oct. 16th deadline. We collected our routine monthly bacteria samples and the results were absent. We also collected two bacteria samples for the new water main on S ave B. Those came back absent as well. Bulk chemicals were filled. We recorded our monthly well levels. We changed bag filters. We also changed cartridge filters on RO1 and RO3. We had 3 apartments on the shut off list and all 3 are back on. We continue to work on and implement our backflow prevention ordinance. The fire alarm panel at the water plant is STILL not working. Midwest Alarms has not been great to work with. The South Tower obstruction lighting got fixed. It is back to working as it should be. We had to replace the photodiode and 2 different boards in the panel. A few months back Riverside borrowed some filters from us and they replaced what they borrowed.

Street/Traffic Lights: Jim Conner has completed the programming at Iowa/Madison. That intersection is upgraded and working as it should be. There was a piece of conduit or cable hanging down from the south side of the underpass, Marie Electric fixed it.

Operators: I took some vacation in August. The family and I went to Texas! I also took a vacation day for a golf fundraiser and a concert in KC. Will and I both split up weekend duties. We both try to carry the on-call phone evenly. Will got signed up for Leadership Washington.

Meetings attended: Weekly staff meetings, Mike Roe met with us about the obstruction lighting, Joe Gaa toured the plant and visited with us for a bit, and Will, JJ, Marshal, and myself attended a IAMU training class in Fairfield over LSLI(lead service line inventory).


SUBJECT: Alley Vacation-Public Hearing and First Reading of Ordinance

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF N. 3RD AVENUE AND A PORTION OF THAT EAST-WEST ALLEY INDENTIFIED AS WASHINGTON COUNTY PARCEL NO. 1117190004.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Washington has been requested by an adjacent property owner to vacate a portion of N. 3rd Avenue located north of E. 3rd Street and a portion of the east-west alley identified as Washington County Parcel No. 1117190004 (the "Parcels"); and

WHEREAS, the Parcels to be vacated are legally described as follows:

All that portion of N. 3rd Avenue located north of E. 3rd Street northerly to the previously vacated portion of N. 3rd Avenue; AND

That portion of Washington County Parcel 1117190004 from its intersection with N. 3rd Avenue westerly to the westerly line of Lot One (1) in Breed's Sub-Division of Lot Five (5) in Block One (1) in the North Addition to the City of Washington, Iowa

WHEREAS, the excess right-of-way is of no use to the City, and should be returned to the tax rolls.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, as follows:

1. <u>Vacation</u>. That the rights-of-way described herein as the Parcels, is hereby vacated.

SUBJECT: Discussion and 1st Reading of Ordinance Amending Chapters 50 and 51

At the September 3rd meeting the Council continued discussion related to possible amendments to Chapter 50 and 51. At that time the first reading was tabled until the September 17th Council meeting to allow for further review. After further discussion, I do believe that we have a version that is an appropriate balance to both property owners and neighbors.

As a reminder, Chapter 50.10 in the City code currently reads:

"Operable vehicles, materials, supplies or related equipment may be parked or stored outside only if placed in a rear yard area, or in a front yard or side yard if such vehicle is parked or stored on a temporary basis, not to exceed 24 consecutive hours, and if the vehicle is parked or stored on an all -weather surfaced area."

The proposed amended definition is included in the attached, proposed ordinance amendment:

"50.10 Parking on Residential Property. Operable vehicles may be parked on a temporary basis, not to exceed 24 consecutive hours in a front year area of a residence. Operable vehicles parked or stored more than 24 hours must be parked on an all-weather surface and only in a rear yard or side yard."

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF WASHINGTON, IOWA, BY AMENDING CHAPTERS 50 AND 51

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council that the Code of Ordinances of the City of Washington, Iowa be amended as follows:

- SECTION 1. <u>Amendment.</u> Section 50.10 entitled "Operable Vehicles" is hereby repealed in its entirety and replaced with the following:
- "50.10 PARKING ON RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY. Operable vehicles may be parked on a temporary basis, not to exceed 24 consecutive hours in a front yard area of a residence. Operable vehicles parked or stored more than 24 hours must be parked on an all-weather surface and only in a rear yard or side yard."
- SECTION 2. <u>Amendment</u>. Section 51.01(5) of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by adding subsections F. and G, which read as follows:
- "F" Any vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer that is not capable of moving in both forward and reverse gears.
 - "G." Any vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer that lacks current registration.
 - i. Mere licensing of a vehicle shall not constitute a defense to the finding that the vehicle is in operable condition, unless previously discussed with the City."
- SECTION 3. <u>Amendment.</u> Section 51.03 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by deleting Section 51.03 in its entirety.
- SECTION 4. <u>Repealer</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- SECTION 5. <u>Adjudication</u>. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- SECTION 6. <u>Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
