Department Activity Report January 2021

The Police Department switched communications over to the new county radio system on January 13th, so far everything seems to be working well and we look forward to having the Fire Department switch over in February to allow for even better communications and interoperability.

January's snow events resulted in several motorist assist calls along with over 75 parking complaints. Fortunately, most residents complied with our warnings and just 8 parking tickets were issued, and five vehicles had to be towed.

We received our credentialing certification from the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy related to the Presidential Executive Order on Safe Policing for Safe Communities issued in June. The certification makes us eligible for federal grant applications.

All officers completed the PLS monthly online training, Investigator VanWilligen completed an Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force Cyber Tip Investigations course and Chief Lester participated in a webinar training on UCR (Uniform Crime Reporting) changes being implemented at the state level.

Dear Chief Lester:

On behalf of the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy this letter confirms we are certifying that the Washington Police Department meets certain eligibility requirements, set forth by the U.S. Department of Justice, for discretionary federal grants. The Washington Police Department is qualified to receive federal grants for three years from the date of this letter.

Pursuant to Section 2 of the Presidential Executive Order on Safe Policing for Safe Communities, dated June 16, 2020, Executive Order No. 13929 (the "Executive Order on Safe Policing"), the U.S. Department of Justice's discretionary grant funding is only available to state, local, and university or college law enforcement agencies that have obtained (or are in the process of seeking) credentials certifying that they meet certain standards on use of force. The Executive Order on Safe Policing empowers the U.S. Attorney General to designate independent credentialing bodies including the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy to certify that a law enforcement agency meets the conditions of eligibility for federal grants.

Based upon review of the materials you have provided, we have determined that the Washington Police Department meets the conditions for certification. Accordingly, the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy will include your agency going forward within our database of certified law enforcement agencies. On or before January 31st each year, we will provide the name of each certified law enforcement agency to the U.S. Department of Justice.
