up" in Washington. The latest is a new "Welcome To Washington" sign on Highway 1 South at the entrance to the Business Park. Yard Waste Center Hours

The Yard Waste Center at 1065 W. Buchanan St is open

Monday through Friday 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The following Saturday dates:

April 13, 20, 27 May 4, 11, 18

7 a.m. to 10 a.m.

(Will not be open on holiday weekends)

Yard Waste Collection

Curbside yard waste collection started March 26 and March 28. Yard waste will be collected west of 2nd Ave on Thursday and east of 2nd Ave on Tuesday. The routes will come to a close on the Wednesday before Thanksgiving.

Bags- The City allows standard, biodegradable, self-standing yard waste bags, (plastic bags are not allowed). Locally, they are available at Ace-n-More, Fareway, HyVee and Walmart. Bags must not exceed 50 lbs.

Bundles– Tree trimmings, brush and twigs will be collected if properly bundled. Tied bundles of trimmings shall be collected if bundles do not exceed 75lbs, 18 inches in diameter and 5ft in length. The bundles should be tied with biodegradable twine or string. Branch size should not exceed 5 inches in diameter. A maximum of 3 bundles will be collected per collection day. Larger quantities of branches are considered commercial and are the responsibility of the owner.

Burning— Residents are allowed to carefully burn dry leaves and twigs on their private property only! (Not in the right-of-way). City ordinance prohibits the burning of any trash, garbage, and green or damp yard waste.

Yard Waste Center— Residents are welcome to haul and dispose of their yard waste and brush at the Yard Waste Center located next to the Waste Water Treatment Plant at 1065 W. Buchanan St.

There are two piles of yard waste. One pile is for tree branches and the other is for yard and garden waste. Please place yard waste in the appropriate pile if you are hauling it yourself. If you bring yard waste in plastic bags, please remember to dump out the contents and take the bags with you.

The YWC does not accept any type of building materials or other debris. So remember, if you didn't grow it, don't throw it!



Now is the time to submit candidacy paperwork and be included on the ballot.

Dispose of the following:

- General junk (small loose materials need to be put into cardboard boxes, no bags)
- Bulky furniture items such as couches, mattresses, box springs, recliners-free
- Appliances-(\$5 fee)
- Electronics-free (except for TV's & CRT Computer monitors-they are \$15) Computers & accessories can be taken to Goodwill for free.
- Lawn mowers & lawn equipment must be gas and oil free for disposal

Purchase stickers for appliances in cash at the cleanup (No checks or credit cards will be taken at site)

We will **not** accept the following items:

- Household garbage not allowed
- Household hazardous waste
- Hazardous materials such as but not limited to explosives, drugs, materials soaked in volatile chemicals
- Tires and waste oil
- Construction materials
- Concrete, brick and rock
- Latex paint
- Lawn mowers and lawn equipment that are <u>not</u> oil free
- Items from outside the Washington City limits
- This is **not** a curbside cleanup. Items left on the curb without proper fees will be subject to penalty.

The City will assist with special pickups, (appliances & TVs only), for those unable to bring them to the site for an additional \$5 appliance fee. Please contact City Hall at 319-653-6584 by Thursday, April 18 to schedule a pickup. Please have items ready for pickup at your curb Thursday, April 18.

More information will be available mid-April at City Hall, Public Library, KCII, Southeast Iowa Union, and Chamber of Commerce. This is a free tree give-away, but donations are appreciated. There will be 100 trees available. There is a limit of one tree per household.

Street Sweeping The City sweeps the streets around the City square each week between the hours of 10 p.m. on Thursday and 6 a.m. on the following Friday. During this time, according to Ordinance 69.09, all night parking is prohibited on any street within the area of the public square and extending one block each way there from, said area bounded by the south line of Second Street, the west line of Second Avenue, the north line of Jefferson Street, and the east line of Avenue B; but not including any portion of Second Street, Second Avenue, Jefferson Street and Avenue B.

City Maintenance also posts signs on the square stating when the street sweeping will occur around the square.



After Memorial Day Cleanup for Elm Grove & Woodlawn Cemeteries

We will begin cleanup after Memorial Day of all decorations, flowers, grave blankets, etc. on **June 15**, **2024 at 7 a.m.** weather permitting. Any decorations left after **June 14**, **2024** will be picked up and disposed of during cemeteries cleanup. Decorations acceptable to leave include: Shepherds' hooks, military markers, monument toppers, planted and potted flowers, and vase flowers. **PLEASE NO GLASS CONTAINERS.** All decorations must be off of the ground and placed on monument stones or foundations. Any decorations left on the ground, if the decorations are not on monuments or monument foundations, will be removed and disposed of.
