WHEREAS, the Property is located in the Washington Unified South Central Residential Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the City for the vacant Development Property to be annexed into the City to be developed for residential housing purposes; and WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapters 15A and 403 of the Code of Iowa, the City has agreed to provide financial assistance to the Developer for the development of residential housing units on the Development Property, pursuant to the rights and obligations described below.

NOW, THEREFORE, ON THE BASIS OF THE PRECEDING RECITALS, AND FOR THE MUTUAL CONSIDERATION OF ENTERING INTO THIS AGREEMENT, THE DEVELOPER AND CITY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

A. Developer's Obligations.

- 1. Contemporaneously with the execution of this Agreement, the Developer shall submit to the City, an application for annexation for the Development Property on a form provided by the City executed by the owner (and spouse, if any) of the Development Property.
- 2. The Developer shall, within twelve (12) months from the date of execution of this Agreement, submit appropriate plans for approval by the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council to comply with the City's zoning and subdivision ordinances, a first phase of a residential subdivision on the portion of the Development Property depicted on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated into this Agreement by this reference (the "First Phase Development").
- 3. The Developer, at its sole cost, shall enter into an agreement for professional engineering services to design for the construction and installation of public streets, water mains, sanitary sewer mains, storm sewer mains and other required improvements (collectively the "Improvements") necessary pursuant to comply the City's zoning, subdivision and other applicable ordinances in order complete the First Phase Development.
- 4. Prior to the acceptance of bids of the Improvements Project by the City as outlined in Section (B)(1)(b) below, the Developer shall submit to the City security in the form of an escrow check to be cashed, monies, payment bond or irrevocable letter of credit, in a form approved by the City, to ensure that the Developer will make the payment needed under this Project (the "Developer Payment"). The Developer Payment will be calculated by taking the accepted lowest responsive, responsible bid for the Improvements Project and subtract \$800,000, which is the City's maximum contribution to the Project. Developer expressly agrees that all costs above the \$800,000 for the Improvements Project shall be the responsibility of the Developer. Developer shall be required to make the Developer payment within seven (7) days of request of the City to the Finance Officer in the amount shown below. Each payment will be calculated by taking the City's \$800,000 maximum contribution towards construction costs and dividing that by the entire project cost by the lowest responsive, responsible bidder for the

project. That quotient will be the City's percentage of cost and the Developer's percentage of cost would equal 100% less the City's percentage of cost. For each monthly progress payment made by the City, the Developer shall pay the Developer's percentage of the cost within seven (7) days of the receipt of a pay estimate or change order by the contractor for the Project.

By way of example, if the bid cost was \$1 million, the Developer percentage would be calculated by taking the \$800,000 city contribution by the \$1 million costs, which would mean the City will pay 80% and the Developer would pay the remaining 20% of the project costs. So on each pay estimate/application, the Developer would owe 20% of the costs.

5. The Developer, recognizing the City's investment in the development of the Development Property, expressly agrees that it will construct a minimum number of residential homes during the term of this Agreement, as follows:

For purposes of this Agreement, a unit is deemed to be completed when a certificate of occupancy has been issued by the City for an individual unit and a five-foot sidewalk has been constructed across all lot frontages. The City must be contacted at least three business days before a final inspection is to be scheduled in order to receive a certificate of occupancy. Failure of the Developer to meet the completed unit counts outlined above shall be deemed a material breach of this Agreement. The City shall have the authority to waive the default fee listed in Section (C) below for one (1) year, on the condition that the foundation has been poured and the framing has been completed and all building permits have been received and approved.

The obligation to construct the required number of units each year shall remain a lien on the Development Property until released by the City. When enough homes have been built that generates enough tax dollars to meet the debt obligation of the \$800,000 bond, said determination to be made in the sole opinion of the City, the remaining units shall not be subject to the lien outlined in this Agreement.

- 6. Developer shall be required to list all lots on the MLS system for sale as soon as the Improvements have been completed.
- 7. As part of this Agreement, the Developer expressly agrees that all lots will be available to all builders who desire to purchase a lot in the Development Property.

B. City's obligations.

- 1. In recognition of the Developer's investment in the Development Property for the construction of residential housing, the City agrees as follows:
 - a) The City shall construct in strict compliance with Chapter 26 of the Code of Iowa, the sewer boring in a location generally shown on Exhibit "A" and labeled as "Bore 650 LF of sewer" (the "Boring Project"). The Boring Project shall be completed by the City no later than six (6) months after the Developer has submitted plans for the Development Project pursuant to Section (A)(2) above. All construction and design costs for the Boring Project shall be borne by the City.
 - b) The City shall construct in strict compliance with Chapter 26 of the Code of Iowa, the municipal improvements to be located on the Property which are shown on the plans designed by Garden and Associates Engineers, said plan set dated ______ (the "Improvements Project"). Prior to the acceptance of bids, the Developer shall place the Security on file with the City in order to ensure that the Developer will pay its share of the Improvements Project.
 - c) The City shall, adopt appropriate plans, amendments and ordinances, pursuant to Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, to place the Development Property into an appropriate Urban Renewal Area of the City as determined by the Washington City Council.
 - d) Prior to the completion of the Improvements by the Developer, the City shall take all necessary steps to issue financing in the amount of not-to-exceed \$800,000, said financing shall be secured within thirty (30) days of acceptance of the Improvements Project and on terms acceptable to the City

C. Default by Developer; repayment.

Because the City is making the economic development grant to the Developer based upon a schedule of new residential units to be constructed, any deviation from the scheduled outlined in Section (A)(5) above will be deemed a default of this Agreement. If the Developer fails to

complete the required number of units at the end of any calendar year, the City will provide written notice to the Developer to cure said default by the end of the proceeding calendar year. In the event that the Developer fails to cure the default by the end of the calendar year, the Developer shall repay to the City, the amount of \$15,000 per unit which has not been completed, but was required by the schedule. (By way of example, if the Developer has only completed 4 units by the end of calendar year 2025, received notice to cure, and has only completed 10 units by the end of calendar year 2026, the Developer's shortfall is four (4) units.) Therefore, the Developer shall, within thirty (30) days of the determination of the Developer's Shortfall, shall pay \$15,000 per unit to the City. The failure of the Developer to pay the Developer's Shortfall shall allow the City, in its sole discretion, to declare a default of the entire agreement and require that the entire \$800,000 be repaid to the City, less \$15,000 credit for each unit that has been completed at the time of the default of the entire agreement.

D. Administrative Provisions.

- 1. Each party represents to the other that the party has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and that this Agreement is a binding Agreement duly authorized by the governing body of each party.
- 2. This Agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties and may not be amended or assigned without the express permission of the other party.
- 3. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties.
- 4. This Agreement shall be deemed to be a contract made under the laws of the State of Iowa, and for all purposes shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Iowa.
- 5. If any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be invalid, illegal or unenforceable to any extent, the remainder of this Agreement and the application thereof shall not be affected and shall be enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- 6. Except for the obligations of a Party to pay monies then due and payable under this Agreement, the obligation of any Party to perform any acts hereunder shall be suspended during the period such performance is prevented by acts of God, war, riot, invasion, fire and accident.
 - 7. That this Agreement may be executed in counterparts.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WASHINGTON, IOWA, 2020, BY REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1105 DECLARING SURPLUS CERTAIN PROPERTIES AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR DISPOSAL

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WASHINGTON, IOWA:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 1105 of the City of Washington, Iowa, 2020, is hereby repealed in its entirety as follows:

Ordinance No. 1105, An Ordinance Declaring Surplus Certain Properties and Providing For Their Disposal Thereof is hereby repealed in its entirety.

ORDINANCE NO. 1105

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING SUPLUS CERTAIN PROPERTIES AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR DISPOSAL THEREOF

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Washington, Washington County, Iowa:

SECTION 1. That a public notice was published at the direction of this Council and a public hearing held to consider declaring surplus properties generally described as:

"The East 133.98 feet of the North 30 feet of the platted East Adams Street located South of and adjacent to Lot 1 of Prairie Ridge Subdivision, Washington, Washington County, Iowa. Containing 4,019.40 square feet more less." And "The East 134.22 feet of the South 30 feet of the platted East Madison Street located North of and adjacent to Lot 5 of Prairie Ridge Subdivision, Washington, Washington County, Iowa. Containing 4,026.60 square feet more or less."

SECTION 2. That the City Council has determined that this property is surplus and wishes to dispose of said property.

SECTION 3. That said properties are hereby declared surplus.

SECTION 4. Following property notice, the City will dispose of these properties by consideration of the passage of a Resolution transferring it to the adjacent land owner.

SECTION 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
