WATER DISTRIBUTION: Personnel repaired two water services located at 1704 North 6th Ave (both new rods). Personnel also repaired a water service box (rod) located at the Vets Memorial on Lexington Blvd. Personnel marked water boxes for the following week's shut off list.

SEWER COLLECTION: Personnel assisted WWTP personnel vacking out the Lexington Blvd lift station. Personnel also jetted, flushed and televised a sewer located at North Iowa Ave-17th St. Another location of jetting and televising located at 702 East 2nd St for an Alliant contractor. Personnel jetted and televised a sewer in the 300 block of West Madison St.

STORM SEWER COLLECTION: Personnel replaced a driveway culvert located at 1323 North 3rd Ave. Personnel spent some time unplugging intakes with .8 inches of rain Friday March 18.

MECHANIC/SHOP: Personnel serviced PD 306, PD 307, #303 (prepped flat bed and put new bedliner on) and refurbished the office, taking carpet out and replacing new ceiling tiles.

- **Hydrogen Sulfide Gas-** We continue to have meetings and conference calls with IRE, NELCO, Fox eng., and City staff to resolve the issue. We did get four more hydrogen sulfide monitors for a total of seven. We have the monitors spread through the sewer system from IRE to the WWTP. We get readings from the monitors once a week, share and go over the information with everyone.
- Hydrogen Sulfide Gas Meters- After meeting with Deanna, Fox, and Kyle at the water plant we pulled 2 of the meters so we could do some H2S testing at the Water Plant to try to pinpoint an unpleasant smell some of the neighbors have expressed concerns about.
- Old WWTP Demo-The demo is going well they just need to back fill and then grading/seeding.
- **SCADA Computer-**The new computer is all set up and recording. We are waiting on a license for the alarm system to put in full service.
- Dissolved Oxygen Meters-We had all the D.O. meters and TSS meter calibrated and serviced. One D.O. meter needs to be replaced along with one keypad and screen on one of the controllers. All other meters checked out.
- Tractor replacement Bids-I've been working on bids for tractor replacement and looked at few of them to bring a recommendation to Council on April 5th.

Water Treatment Plant: March 2022 Council Report

Here is a summary of the major updates and activities from the Water Treatment Department for March 2022.

Street Lights: Nick Pacha and Jason Peterson along with Ace Electric have taken the lead on the downtown decorative light outage. Different sections of lights have been tripping the breaker on the southeast side of the square. After thorough troubleshooting, it seems they have fixed the problem. The street light that was stuck on in front of JP's got fixed. Joe Marie is aware of the 2 street lights out in front of KCII. They should be fixed soon. We will be doing a traffic light inventory this month and placing an order in May.

Water Plant Operations: I submitted February's MOR to the DNR. I re-certified our ERP with the EPA and DNR. We changed 25 dead meters this month. Ordered more water meters. We read water meters, books 1,2,4,7, and the list of extra monthly reads. We had 3 apartments on the shutoff list and all 3 are turned back on. We collected routine monthly bacteria samples; results were absent. We collected 5 special bacteria samples; 4 were for the Buchanan new water main and the other for Boyd's Bologna. All 5 of those samples came back good. We also collected and delivered our 1st quarter samples for Radionuclides. Our bulk chemicals were delivered and filled up. We collected our monthly well levels. Jason and Parker from WWTP continued to move H2S meters around the facility. They did get some readings but they were not as high as we expected. They are going to try again when it warms up. We changed bag filters and RO 2 & 3 cartridge filters. We replumbed a valve on the chlorine day tank that was leaking. We greased pumps and motors. Our printer stopped working. Karolyn with Impression's Computers came and looked at it and deemed it unfixable. We had Jetco, the original provider and I.T. support for our SCADA, find us one and set it up.

Thanks to Brody, the city mechanic, as he serviced both our vehicles this month.

We ran a full set of labs for curious residents at 1509 N 3rd Ave. We collected a sample from their house and took it back to our lab for testing. We also ran a chlorine test while at the house. I typed a report and delivered the results to them. I think this will help to assure them Washington has safe drinking water.

I would like to thank the Parks department. They do a lot for our department and it does not go unnoticed. They do our snow removal, keep up with the downtown square and Blvd decorative lighting, mowing, trimming, spraying, ect. Just last week Jason came and cleaned up the north side of the plant by trimming bushes and pulling nuisance vines.

Operators: Will took and passed his Grade III Water Treatment Exam. This is a big deal as now Will is fully certified to operate and sign off on official business with the EPA and lowa DNR. Will is now certified as a Grade III Treatment and Grade II Distribution Water Operator. I passed my Grade III Water Distribution Exam. I'm a Grade III in both Water Treatment and Distribution, as well, a Grade II in Wastewater Treatment.

Meetings attended: Weekly staff meetings; 1 on 1 with Deanna; Meter reading meeting with Deanna; Safety meeting; and a IRWA class.
