- After hour alarm and dog call outs 30th Lexington lift station alarm, pump #2 not in auto, 5:00 a.m. Parker
- **Dept Head meetings** I attended the meetings on January 3rd & 10th.
- 2017/2018 budget Submitted next year's proposed budget to Brent on January 4, 2017. Met with Brent on January 16, 2017 to discuss the WWTP budget.
- WWTP December 2016 Discharge Monitoring Report (DMR) Average daily flow 1.234 million gallons (mg), maximum daily flow 1.663 mg, minimum daily flow 1.000 mg. There were no violations of the WWTP's NPDES discharge permit. Total precipitation for December 2016 = >1.01" (recorded at the WWTP).

CBOD5 removal 85% required result = 100% Influent CBOD5 monthly average = 93.7 mg/L 0.0 mg/L

TSS removal 85% required result = 97.8%Influent TSS monthly average = 180.4 mg/LEffluent TSS monthly average = 4.0 mg/L

- Lexington lift station We had a pump alarm call at Lexington on the 3rd. The alarm was showing moisture in one of the pump's motor. We took the pump out of service and contacted Iowa Pump Works (IPW). The lift station has a two year maintenance bond that expires in February 2018 so the repair work is covered under warranty. IPW showed on the 5th up to pull the pump and take it back to their shop for inspection and repair. IPW checked inside the control panel before pulling the pump out of the wet well. IPW discovered the wires from the pump to the wire terminal inside the control were all loose. IPW tightened all the pump wires and put the pump back in service. The pump started pumping without tripping an alarm so I think the problem is fixed. We will continue to monitor the pump and make sure it was not damaged due to the loose wires.
- SBR decanter VFD faults Jeff from JETCO was at the WWTP on the 4th to look at the SBR decanter VFD's to see if there was an electrical problem that was causing the recent VFD faults. Jeff couldn't find any electrical issues in the VFDs. Jason and Jeff swapped motors between two decanters to see if it could possibly be a decanter motor problem. We haven't had any faults since the motors have been swapped. We will continue to monitor this since the faults are random.
- Sensa-phone (alarm phone dialer) @ Parkside Estates (PSE) lift station We were having problems at the lift station with the phone service. Jason discovered you couldn't call out from PSE. Jason contacted Windstream to troubleshoot the phone line. Windstream made the repairs. Jason then discovered the alarm dialer wouldn't call out to report any alarms. He removed the alarm dialer and replaced it with a used on we had on hand. PSE's alarm dialer is now working properly and calls out when an alarm condition is triggered.

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RESOLUTION ADOPTING AND LEVYING FINAL SCHEDULE OF ASSESSMENTS AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF FOR DIVISION 1, SITLER DRIVE, OF THE SITLER DRIVE AND SOUTH H AVENUE 2016 PAVING PROJECT.

BE IS RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Washington, Washington County, Iowa, that after full consideration, that the final schedule of assessments and accompanying plat, for Division 1, Sitler Drive, of the Sitler Drive and South H Avenue 2016 Paving Project be and the same are hereby approved and adopted, and that there be and is hereby assessed and levied, as a special tax against and upon each lot, parts of lots and parcels of land, and the owner or owners thereof liable to assessment for the cost of said improvements, the respective sums expressed in figures set opposite to each of the same on account of the cost of the construction of said improvements. Provided further, that the amounts shown in said final schedule of assessments as deficiencies are found to be proper and are levied conditionally against the respective properties benefitted by the improvements as shown in the schedule, subject to the provisions of Section 384.63, Code of Iowa. Said assessments against said lots and parcels of land are hereby declared to be in proportion to the special benefits conferred upon said property by said improvements, and not in excess thereof, and not in excess of 25% of the value of same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said assessments of \$100.00 or more shall be payable in ten (10) equal annual installments and shall bear interest at the rate of four percent (4%) per annum from the date of the acceptance of the improvements; the first installment of each assessment, or total amount thereof, if it be less than \$100.00, with interest on the whole assessment from the date of acceptance of the work by the City Council, shall become due and payable on February 20, 2017; succeeding annual installments, with interest on the whole unpaid amount, shall respectively become due on July 1st annually thereafter, and shall be paid at the same time and in the same manner as the September semiannual payment of ordinary taxes. Said assessments shall be payable at the office of the City Clerk, in full or in part and without interest within thirty days after the first publication of the notice of the filing of the final plat and schedule of assessments to the County Treasurer of Washington County, Iowa.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk be and is hereby directed to certify said final plat and schedule to the County Treasurer of Washington County, Iowa, and to publish notice of said certification once each week for two consecutive weeks in The Washington Evening Journal newspaper, a newspaper printed wholly in the English language, and of general circulation in Washington, Iowa, the first publication of said notice to be made within fifteen days from the date of the filing of said schedule with the County Treasurer, the Clerk shall also send by ordinary mail to all property owners whose property is subject to assessment a copy of said notice, said mailing to be on or before the date of the second publication of the notice, all as provided and directed by Code Section 384.60, Code of Iowa.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk is directed to certify the deficiencies (if any) for lots specially benefitted by the improvements, as shown in the final schedule of assessments, to the County Treasurer for recording in the Special Assessment Deficiencies Book and to the city official charged with responsibility for the issuance of building permits. Said deficiencies are conditionally assessed to the respective properties under Code Section 384.63 for the amortization period specified by law.

BENEFITTED AREA

All properties fronting the improvements within an established distance receive a special traffic operations, storm water drainage, and pedestrian accessibility benefit from the completion of this public improvement.

DESCRIPTION OF IMPROVEMENTS

The work included widening of the existing pavement with new PCC pavement including integral curb and gutter, repair of damaged portions of the existing pavement, new storm sewer intakes with associated underground storm sewer, and a five foot wide PCC sidewalk on the north side of the street.

LOCATION OF IMPROVEMENTS

Improvements are located at Sitler Drive between South Iowa Avenue and B Avenue South.

METHOD OF ASSESSMENT

The Flint Formula is the assessment method utilized to distribute the costs among the adjacent property owners. The benefit received by each property is calculated by the length of frontage along the improvement and the proximity to the improvements. The Flint Formula cuts the assessment in half for each 50 feet the property is removed from the improvements to a maximum distance of 300 feet. The assessment is zero beyond the 300 feet.

A chart of the Flint Formula is included in the Appendix.

BASIS OF ASSESSMENT

The assessment policy for the City of Washington indicates that the property owner will be assessed at a maximum assessment rate of 40% of the cost for the pavement, base material, and sidewalk along the frontage. The special benefit for each property will be considered individually and the assessment rate may be adjusted lower by Council. Intersection paving, storm sewers, and all other costs will be paid for by the City.

The benefitted properties are those properties which fall within 300 feet of the road right-of-way, or half the distance to the next platted street, whichever is less.

The assessment schedule is located in the appendix.



Re: Discussion of Possible Changes to Chapter 23, Park Commission

As discussed during goal-setting, I met with the Park Board to discuss the possibility of expanding the board membership and going to an appointed rather than elected board. As we have discussed, it would be helpful to expand the representation on the board beyond the current three-member setup, and the six-year terms and requirement for candidates to have their name placed on the ballot serve as deterrents to some good candidates. The Park Board itself had discussed this possibility itself a couple of years back.

Kevin has reviewed the applicable Iowa Code sections on how to proceed, and I have put together a proposed schedule based on that. Essentially, the Council would need to hold a public hearing and then vote to dissolve the administrative agency currently set up in our code, and then turn around adopt an ordinance setting up a new advisory board. All of the members of the new board would then need to be appointed. To my knowledge, all of the current members would be interested in continuing to serve on the new board, and I would recommend this if they are interested.

It is possible we could have some of the ordinance readings concurrent with workshops to give ourselves a little more breathing room on the schedule, since we would push right up against July 1 with this schedule. The schedule anticipates that if you would like to proceed, that we hold more discussion at the February 7 meeting. However, if you feel we are ready to proceed with the process now, you could choose to set the public hearing for February 7.

We are ready to proceed on the engineering agreement with Garden & Associates for the South 15^{th} Avenue street & subdivision project. Thanks to Kevin for his work on this agreement. Our hope is by having you consider this now that we will be able to get the survey work done soon and be on track for late summer bidding.

ENGINEERING SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered as of this _____ day of _____, 2017, by and between the City of Washington, Iowa, a Municipal Corporation, 215 E. Washington Street, Washington, Iowa 52353, hereinafter referred to as the "CITY," and Garden & Associates, Ltd., 1701 3rd Street, Suite 1, Oskaloosa, Iowa 52577, hereinafter referred to as the "CONSULTANT".

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Washington did heretofore deem it necessary and desirable to construct an extension of S. 15th Avenue between E. Washington Street and E. Adams Street, to facilitate residential development in the City (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the CITY did heretofore determine that it is necessary and proper to acquire professional engineering services to assist the CITY in the design of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT is capable of supplying the desired professional services for a fee of not-to-exceed \$59,500.00; and

WHEREAS, accordingly, the CITY has agreed to engage the CONSULTANT as an independent contractor to assist in the design and construction of the Project for a total consulting fee not to exceed \$59,500.00 under the terms and conditions set forth below.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY AND THE CONSULTANT, FOR CONSIDERATION HEREINAFTER SET FORTH, DO MUTUALLY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

I. SCOPE OF SERVICES.

The CONSULTANT shall perform in a timely and satisfactory manner the consistent with standard, professional practice the engineering services in connection with the Project as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated into this Agreement by this reference.

II. TIME OF COMPLETION.

The CONSULTANT shall complete the services to be rendered hereunder, excluding the construction administration as shown on Exhibit "A" no later than June 30, 2017.

III. GENERAL TERMS AND PROVISIONS.

- A. The CONSULTANT shall not commit any of the following employment practices in connection with or while rendering services hereunder and does hereby expressly agree to prohibit the following practices from being committed by any subcontractors engaged by the CONSULTANT in connection with the Project. Upon request, the CONSULTANT shall provide the CITY with a copy of the relevant provisions of any agreement entered into by the CONSULTANT and a subcontractor in connection with the Project to confirm to the satisfaction of the CITY that the requirements under this Subparagraph III(A) have been met.
- 1. To discharge or refuse to hire any individual because of their race, color, religion, sex, national origin, disability, age, marital status, sexual orientation or gender identity.
- 2. To discriminate against any individual in terms, conditions or privileges of employment because of their race, color, religion, sex, national origin, disability, age, marital status, sexual orientation or gender identity.
- B. The CITY may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause, upon no less than seven (7) calendar days' written notice. In the event that the CITY does so terminate this Agreement, the CONSULTANT shall be paid for all work and services performed up to the time of said termination upon submission to the CITY of a final billing statement and review and approval thereof by the Washington City Council at the next regularly scheduled Council Meeting; provided, however, that any such sum shall not be greater than the total amount to be paid for services rendered hereunder as set forth in Article IV below; and further provided that, in the event the CITY terminates this Agreement with cause, the CITY may, in its sole discretion, elect to withhold payment of an amount sufficient to engage a third party to properly complete the Services in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- C. This Agreement shall not be assigned or in any manner transferred by the CONSULTANT, without the express written consent of the Washington City Council.
- D. It is hereby expressly acknowledged and agreed by both parties hereto that the engagement of the CONSULTANT by the CITY in connection with the Project shall be as an independent contractor and shall be exclusive; provided, however, that the Contractor may retain the services of subcontractors for the purpose of performing its obligations and responsibilities under this Agreement so long as the CONSULTANT has first obtained the written approval of same from the CITY; and further provided that, should the CONSULTANT so engage subcontractors under the terms of this Subparagraph III(D), the CONSULTANT shall be solely responsible for compensating any such subcontractors.

- E. The CITY shall make all criteria, design and construction standards, and information regarding the CITY's requirements for the Project available to the CONSULTANT upon reasonable request by the CONSULTANT therefor. The CITY shall furnish reasonable assistance to the CONSULTANT in the use of said information and documentation at the request of CONSULTANT.
- F. It is further agreed that neither party to this Agreement shall perform contrary to any federal or state law, rule or regulation, or the Washington City Code of Ordinances.
- G. At the request of the CITY, the CONSULTANT shall attend meetings of the City Council that relate to the Project hereunder.
- H. The CONSULTANT agrees to certify all reports, specifications, and drawings with the seal of a professional engineer affixed thereto or such other seal as required by State law.
- I. Upon termination of this Agreement and request of the CITY, the CONSULTANT shall provide the CITY with copies of all basic notes and sketches, charts, computations, maps, plans, drawings and any other data prepared or obtained by the CONSULTANT pursuant to this Agreement without cost, and without restrictions or limitations as to the use thereof in connection with the Project. Furthermore, should the CONSULTANT prepare or receive any of the data set forth in the immediately preceding sentence in digitized format, the CONSULTANT shall furnish said data in disk form upon termination of this Agreement. It is understood, however, that the CONSULTANT shall not be liable for the CITY's use of such documents, materials or data on other projects.
- J. Original drawings prepared by the CONSULTANT under this Agreement shall become the property of the CITY. The CONSULTANT shall be allowed to keep copies for the CONSULTANT's own filing use.
- K. Fees paid in order to secure approval of authorities having jurisdiction over the Project shall be paid by the CITY.
- L. Upon payment in full in accordance with this Agreement, all instruments of services generated by CONSULTANT shall become the property of the CITY.
- M. CONSULTANT shall provide and maintain insurance throughout said Project in the following minimum amounts:
- 1. Workman's Compensation and occupational disease insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of Iowa covering all employees who perform any of the obligations under this Agreement
- 2. Professional Liability or Errors or Omissions Insurance covering all aspects of the

Project in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence of \$2,000,000 aggregate coverage.

- 3. General Liability insurance covering all operations under the Agreement, limits for bodily injury or death not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for one person and two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) for each accident; for property damage not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for each accident and two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) aggregate during such policy period. Said insurance shall name the City of Washington as an Additional Insured under the policy.
- 4. Automobile liability insurance on all self-propelled vehicles used in connection with the Agreement, whether its own, non-owned or hired; public liability limits of not less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) for one person and one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for each accident; property damage limit of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) for each accident or a combined single limit of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00)

CITY shall have the right at any time to require public liability insurance, errors and omissions coverage and/or property damage liability insurance greater than that specified in the above paragraphs. If required, the additional premiums shall be added to the bid price.

The CONSULTANT shall furnish Certificates of Insurance to the CITY made in favor of the CITY prior to commencing work showing compliance with the foregoing requirements. Insurance shall provide notice of cancellation or revocation.

IV. COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES.

The CITY shall compensate the CONSULTANT for services rendered under this Agreement for a total fee of \$59,500.00. Said total fee shall be paid by the CITY to the CONSULTANT upon the completion of each of the Items below:

1.	Preliminary and Final Design Bidding Phase	\$52,500
2.	Construction Phase	\$4,500
3.	Additional Services (Easements, legals)	\$2,500

; provided, however, in express acknowledgment that this Agreement is a COMPLETION DATE CONTRACT without which the CITY would not have engaged the CONSULTANT.

V. INDEMNIFICATION, ENGINEERING STANDARDS.

The CONSULTANT agrees to fully indemnify, save and hold the CITY, its officers, representatives, and employees, harmless from liability to third parties (including reimbursement of reasonable legal fees and costs) arising directly from the negligent act, error or omission of the CONSULTANT, its officers, representatives, agents or employees in connection with the Project.

The CONSULTANT represents to the CITY that it will perform its obligations under this Agreement in conformance with the generally accepted standards of the engineering profession.

VI. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS.

The CONSULTANT hereby represents that the CONSULTANT (i) has not created nor contributed to the creation or existence, (ii) nor will it create or contribute to the creation or existence of any type of hazardous or toxic wastes, materials, chemical compounds, or substances, or any other type of environmental hazard or pollution, whether latent or patent, at the premises of the Project, or in connection with or related to the Project. The CONSULTANT, in addition to the general indemnification set forth in Provision V above, does hereby further fully indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the CITY, its officers, employees and agents from and against any and all debts, claims, causes of action, administrative orders and notices, costs (including but not limited to, response and/or remedial costs), personal injuries, losses, damages, liabilities, demands, interest, fines, penalties and expenses, including reasonable legal fees and expenses, consultants' fees and expenses, court costs and all other out-of-pocket expenses, suffered or incurred by the CITY, its officers, representatives, agents, contractors, subcontractors, employees and grantees as a result of any breach of this Provision VI.

VII. INTERPRETATION.

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the generally accepted standards of the Engineering Profession; provided, however, that it is expressly understood and agreed by both parties that to the extent, if at all, the explicit terms and conditions of this Agreement are in conflict with said generally accepted professional standards, said accepted professional standards shall control in the event of a dispute between the parties hereto.

VIII. SURVIVAL.

All express representations, indemnifications or limitations of liability made in or given in this Agreement shall survive the completion of the services to by rendered by the CONSULTANT hereunder or the termination of this Agreement for any reason.

IX. CONTROLLING LAW.

This Agreement is to be governed by the laws of the State of Iowa. The parties hereto agree that any action, suit or proceeding based upon any matter, claim or controversy arising under this Agreement shall be brought solely in the state courts located in Washington County, Iowa or the federal courts located in Scott County, Iowa. The parties hereto hereby irrevocably waive objection to the venue of the above-mentioned courts, including any claim that such action, suit or proceeding has been brought in an inconvenient forum. Both parties hereto expressly acknowledge and agree that nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to require the parties to submit to mandatory arbitration or mediation in the event of a breach or dispute hereunder.

X. HEADINGS.

The headings of sections of this Agreement are for convenient reference only and shall not be deemed to limit, construe, affect, modify or alter the meaning of such sections.

XI. SEVERABILITY.

If any section, subsection, term or provision of this Agreement or the application thereof to the CONSULTANT, the CITY or a particular circumstance shall, to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of said section, subsection, term or provision of this Agreement or the application of same to the CONSULTANT, the CITY or particular circumstances other than that for which it was held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby and each remaining section, subsection, term or provision of this Agreement shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

XII. MODIFICATION.

The terms of this Agreement may not be changed, waived, discharged or terminated orally, but only by a written document signed by the party against whom enforcement of the change, waiver, discharge or termination is sought.

XIII. WAIVER.

No waiver by the CITY of any default hereunder shall operate as a waiver of any other default or of the same default on any future occasion. No delay on the part of the CITY in exercising any right or remedy hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof. No single or partial exercise of any right or remedy by the CITY shall preclude future exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right or remedy.

XIV. AUTHORITY.

The persons signing this Agreement represents that they have the authority to sign as, or on behalf of, the party for whom they are signing.

XV. FINAL AGREEMENT:

Both the CONSULTANT and the CITY hereby expressly acknowledge and agree that this Agreement is intended to set forth the entire agreement between the parties regarding the services to be rendered by the CONSULTANT to the CITY in connection with the Project, that there are no other considerations or monies contingent upon or resulting from the execution of this Agreement, and that no other monies or considerations have been solicited. No waiver, change, modification or amendment of this Agreement shall be binding upon either party hereto unless in writing and signed by both the CONSULTANT and the CITY. The waiver by either party hereto of a breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach of that provision or of any other provision or condition in this Agreement.

 - G. Cemeteries of ten (10) acres or more in size.
 - H. Churches, chapels, or parish houses located not less than twenty (20) feet from any side lot line in any "R" district.
 - I. Any building or structure occupied or used for nursery, elementary, junior high or high schools, public libraries, and similar public cultural uses located not less than twenty (20) feet from any side lot line.
 - J. A single family detached dwelling located on a lot or parcel which is less than twenty (20) acres as long as the lot of parcel upon which said single family detached dwelling will be constructed was:
 - i. Part of an original lot or parcel that totals more than forty (40) acres; and
 - ii. The original lot or parcel was occupied by, and owned or beneficially controlled, by a lineal descendant of ancestor of the beneficial owner of the original lot or parcel as defined in Section 450.9 of the Code of Iowa
 - K. Sale of nursery and greenhouse products.

- 1. Permitted Principal Uses.
 - A. Agriculture and agricultural buildings except as provided by subsection (2)(D) of this section and provided that livestock shall not be housed or fed within two hundred (200) feet of any lot in an "R" district.
 - B. Public parks, playgrounds, and recreational areas.
 - C.B. Essential services as defined in Section 165.01 and municipal administrative or public service building or properties, except such uses as storage yards, warehouses, garages, or other uses customarily conducted as gainful business, provided any building is located not less than twenty (20) feet from any lot in any "R" District.
 - D. Cemeteries of ten (10) acres or more in size.
 - E. Churches, chapels, or parish houses located not less than twenty (20) feet from any side lot line in any "R" district.

1. <u>Amendment.</u> Section 165.23(2)(B) of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by deleting the ordinance in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

"In all residential districts, there shall be a required minimum front yard as stated in each individual residential zoning classification district. However, in the case where lots within two hundred (200) feet on either side of a lot of record are developed with a greater or lesser setback than required in each individual zoning district, the front yard setback for this particular lot shall be the average of the building setbacks for the lots of record within two hundred (200) feet on either side of said lot. The final determination of the setback shall be computed by the Building and Zoning Administrator."

- 2. <u>Repealer.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- 3. <u>Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

<u>Current Code 165.23(2)(B)</u>

In any district where the average depth of two (2) or more existing front yards on lots within one hundred (100) feet of the lot in question and within the same block front is less or greater than the least front yard depth prescribed, front yards may be varied. The depth of the front yard on such lot shall not be less than the average of said existing front yards or the average depth on the two (2) lots immediately adjoining, or, in the case of a corner lot, the depth of the front yard on the lot immediately adjoining; provided, however, that the depth of a front yard on a lot in any "R" district shall be at least fifteen (15) feet and need not exceed sixty (60) feet.

Recommended Code Replacement 165.23(2)(b)

In all residential districts, there shall be a required minimum front yard as stated in each individual residential zoning classification district. However, in the case where lots within two hundred (200) feet on either side of a lot of record are developed with a greater or lesser setback than required in each individual zoning district, the front yard setback for this particular lot shall be the average of the building setbacks for the lots of record within two hundred (200) feet on either side of said lot. The final determination of the setback shall be computed by the Building and Zoning Administrator.

This change is recommended to eliminate the 15' minimum required setback for infill lots. There are a couple of places in town that we have removed dilapidated houses in neighborhoods that would not meet the 15' setback. This would make a new house look out of proportion with the rest of the neighborhood and make some lots unbuildable. Kevin Olson drafted the wording and he says this is the most common approach to infill lots.

 - "Removal of Certain Signs. The following signs shall be removed at the owner's expense:
 - 1. Any existing sign which previously advertised a bond fide business or product sold shall be removed after thirty (30) days from the date at which the bona fide business no longer exists on the site of the sign.
 - 2. Any existing sign which advertises, promotes or advocates for an event that occurs on a specific date shall be removed within fourteen (14) days after said specific event."
- 2. <u>Repealer.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
- 3. <u>Adjudication.</u> If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- 4. <u>Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

165.20 SIGNS.

- General Provisions.
- A. Applicability. All permanent, temporary and portable signs shall meet all requirements as set forth in this section.
- B. Permit Required. A zoning certificate pursuant to the provisions of Section 165.24 shall be required for all signs except temporary garage sale, open house, window signs and real estate signs.
 - C. Area Defined. The area of a sign shall be determined as follows:
 - (1) The total area of all permanent exterior signs visible from a public way.
 - (2) The total area of permanent signs placed upon the surface of windows and doors visible from a public way.
 - (3) The total area within the outline enclosing the lettering, modeling or insignia of signs integral with the wall and not designed as a panel.
- D. Corner Lot Frontage. A building or use having frontage on two (2) streets may include twenty percent (20%) of the length of the lot facing the second street.
- E. Removal of Certain Signs. Any sign existing which no longer advertises a bona fide business conducted, or product sold, shall be taken down and removed by the owner, agent or person having the beneficial use of the property upon which such sign may be found within thirty (30) days of written notification from the City. Upon failure to comply with such notice within the time specified in such order, the City is hereby authorized to cause removal of such signs, and any expense incidental thereto shall be paid by the owner of the building or structure to which said sign is attached.

Removal of Certain Signs. The following signs shall be removed at the owner's expense:

- 1. Any existing sign which previously advertised a bond fide business or product sold shall be removed after thirty (30) days from the date at which the bona fide business no longer exists on the site of the sign.
- 2. Any existing sign which advertises, promotes or advocates for an event that occurs on a specific date shall be removed within thirty (14) days after said specific event.
- F. Interference. No billboard, signboard or similar advertising signs shall be located at an intersection so as to obstruct vision, hearing, pedestrian or vehicular safety, or the use and enjoyment of the adjoining property.

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A RESOLUTION SETTING A POLICY FOR EMPLOYEE RECOGNITION EVENT
