MAINTENANCE & CONSTRUCTION DEPT. REPORT 12-29-18/1-25-19 (4 week report)

STREETS: Personnel plowed snow routes on multiple occasions and hauled the snow away from the downtown area. Personnel salted on numerous occasions as well. Personnel picked up Xmas trees in Central Park and throughout the City on corners, less than 50 trees total. Crews cut down 15 hazardous trees as well, the stumps will be bid out in Feb after our EAB committee meeting. Personnel finished up 2018 leaf season.

WATER DISTRIBUTION: Personnel repaired 2 water leaks, located at 501 South 11th Ave (6 inch CIP) and 523 North 7th Ave service line (on East 6th St). Personnel excavated for a new water service located at 107 West 15th St, we will have to excavate again in the spring as it is temporarily tied into an existing service line. Personnel located water boxes for nonpayment, which there were 22 to shut off.

SEWER COLLECTION: Personnel jetted a sanitary sewer in the 200 block of West 2nd St.

STORM SEWER COLLECTION: Personnel pushed around corners for proper drainage.

MECHANIC/SHOP: Personnel serviced PD 97 (install rear end and broken shift cable), 601 (repaired radiator and finished adding oil ready for snow, salt only), PD 905 (electrical issue), 301 (install new bed, install new light wires, new fenders, installed salt spreader, batteries and altenator), snow pusher (welded top bracket), 119 (plow bolts broke) and PD 79 to get viper out and installed in new Explorer (new ID# 232).

OTHER: Personnel responded to 67 One Call Locates. Personnel worked on budget material. Installed 12 reflective signs at three locations on the

newly installed fence around the M/C Dept and WTP. A couple personnel assisted at the Cemetery for a few services.

Re: Southeast Sanitary Sewer Basin Project Hearing & Bids

As authorized by the City Council on January 2, we sought bids for the project and received 2 timely bids on January 29 (a 3rd bid arrived late by FedEx and thus had to be returned unopened to that firm). The results were very good. The recommendation, which is detailed in engineer Steve Soupir's attached letter, is to accept the low bid from Municipal Pipe Tool of Hudson, Iowa, including both bid alternates. Even with both bid alternates selected, we are still slightly below the engineer's estimate for the base bid alone. The recommended amount is \$1,079,630.10.

This project is funded partially by a \$600,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). In order to utilize the full grant, we would need to have \$1,337,399 in eligible work (only construction work counts for this project). Thus, we are investigating what additional work within the basin would still be eligible under the CDBG, and may have a significant change order of up to \$258,000 at a later time to max out the grant amount. If this does not work out, we would have to give up approximately \$116,000 of the grant, but would have around \$142,000 in extra bond funds that could be applied to the next major sewer project, which is planned to be the 2020 North 4th Sewer Separation & Street project.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, FORM OF CONTRACT, AND ESTIMATE OF COST

WHEREAS, FOX Engineering Associates, Inc. has prepared plans, specifications, form of contract and estimate of cost for the construction of certain public improvements described in general as "2019 Southeast Basin I&I Reduction Project"; and

Dear Mayor and City Council:

The City of Washington received bids on January 29, 2019 for the SE Basin I&I Reduction Project, Phase 1. Work will consist of approximately 500 SY of pavement removal and replacement for work associated with a collection system rehabilitation project. The project consists of cementitious liner of 19 manholes, removal and replacement of one manhole, 16,000 LF of CCTV pre and post construction inspections, internal sanitary sewer main line patching, and nine (9) sanitary sewer main open cut point repairs at various locations throughout the collection system. The project will also consist of CIPP lining approximately 16,000 LF of various size sanitary sewer main.

The City received two bids on the project. The Engineer's opinion of probable construction cost for the base bid was \$1,143,928.50. Base bids ranged from a high bid of \$906,136.60 to a low bid of \$888,389.10. The low base bid is \$255,539.40 below the Engineer's opinion of probable construction cost. A Bid Tabulation Summary is attached for your reference and the following is a summary of the base bids received:

 Municipal Pipe Tool Co., LLC \$888,389.10

 Visu-Sewer, Inc. \$906,136.60

FOX contacted Municipal Pipe Tool Co, LLC to discuss their bid, schedule, and similar projects that they have completed in Iowa. Municipal Pipe Tool believes their bid is reasonable and has found no errors in its review. Municipal Pipe Tool believes the contract dates for substantial completion will give ample time for the work to be completed. They've also stated that they are looking forward to getting started on this project right away after notice is given.

To evaluate their Bid, we discussed their current projects and reviewed their performance on previous projects. Municipal Pipe Tool has been in business since 1967 and FOX has worked on a number of projects with Municipal Pipe Tool over many years. Based on our previous experience with this contractor, it is anticipated that Municipal Pipe Tool can complete the work indicated in the contract

documents. In addition, it is anticipated that the FOX Engineering will be completing part-time observation services to observe the Contractors progress during construction.

The project includes Bid Alternate No. 1 and Bid Alternate No. 2 for council consideration. The Bid Alternate No. 1 Bid amount from Municipal Pipe Tool Company, LLC is \$90,136.00 and includes approximately 169 vertical feet of additional manhole lining. Bid Alternate No. 2 is in the amount of \$101,105.00 and includes approximately 218 vertical feet of an additional manhole lining. The addition of any bid alternate or a combination of the bid alternates does not change the apparent low bidder for the project.

Council should review the Bid Alternates to determine if it should be awarded. Council has the option of awarding any of the bid alternates, or a combination of both, in addition to the base bid. If council elects to award Bid Alternate No. 1 and 2, the total project award amount is \$1,079,630.10.

Based on the information contained herein, it is the opinion of FOX Engineering Associates, Inc. that Municipal Pipe Tool Company, LLC has a practical knowledge of the work, adequate equipment, necessary supervisory personnel and financial resources to complete the work. It is the opinion of FOX Engineering Associates, Inc. that the bid by Municipal Pipe Tool Company, LLC represents the lowest responsive, responsible bid for the project. Therefore, FOX recommends that the SE Basin I&I Reduction Project be awarded to Municipal Pipe Tool Co., LLC for the total of the Base Bid and Bid Alternates No. 1 and 2 of \$1,079,630.10.

Prior to the City of Washington approving the contract, the city's insurance counsel should review the contractor's insurance certificate, performance bond, and maintenance bond for conformance with the city's requirements.



The Department

Washington's department includes 11 sworn full-time officers (including Chief and 2 Lieutenants), 4 sworn part-time officers, 1 full-time administrative assistant, and 1 part-time administrative assistant. The department fulfills functions including SWAT, K-9, investigations, drug task force, and many more. The department was recently authorized to purchase a new K-9 unit, which is expected to go in service this spring with a new handler as the current K-9 retires. The department's annual budget is approximately \$1.3 million.

Department equipment includes: 3 patrol SUVs, 3 administrative SUVs, 1 K-9 SUV, 1 CRU (Critical Response Unit), and 1 MRAP (Mine-Resistant Ambush Protected armored personnel carrier). The department expects to be able to replace 2 patrol units in 2019 and the third in 2020, and be on an approximate 3-year cycle for replacement of all patrol units from that point forward. Other priorities include complete replacement of the department's tasers within the next two budget years.

All officers in the department have at least five years' professional experience in law enforcement, but six of these officers are age 31 or under. It is considered very important that the new Chief work to develop leadership and training opportunities within the department to ensure continued success and long-term sustainability.

Facility Improvements


The City of Washington is currently constructing a 14,918 square foot Fire Station, expected to be complete July 31, 2019. When that building, which is connected to the existing Municipal Building, is completed the City will begin renovating the existing 9,403 square foot building for City Hall and Police functions (the facility hosts all three functions currently). This renovation will allow for a much-improved facility, as the department has operated out of very limited and cramped quarters in recent years. The Police Department is planned to have a locker room, conference room, 3 interview rooms, pre-evidence/evidence storage, armory, and expanded staff offices and storage. The department will also have access to a wash bay, training room, exercise room, and much more in the new Fire Station, as well as access to a break room/kitchen area and additional meeting rooms in the new City Hall portion. The City Hall/Police improvements are planned to be complete by June 30, 2020.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE VACATING CERTAIN PLATTED STREETS AND ALLEYS

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Washington, Washington County, Iowa:

SECTION 1. That a public notice was published at the direction of this Council and a public hearing held to consider the vacating of certain platted streets and alleys generally described as follows:

"The 16' wide North and South alley lying between Lots 1-4 and 5-8 in Block 5 of L & W Smouse's Northeast Addition to Washington; and The 16' wide North and South alley lying between Lots 1-3 and 6-8 in Block 6 of L & W Smouse's Northeast Addition to Washington; and E 5th Street lying between the east line of N 4th Avenue and the east line of N

E. $5t^h$ Street lying between the east line of N. $4t^h$ Avenue and the east line of N. 5th Avenue; and

N. 5th Avenue lying between the south line of E. 6th Street and the south line of E. 5th Street;

all in Washington, Washington County, Iowa."

SECTION 2. That the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the public to vacate said streets and alleys in order to allow for replatting of the adjacent City-owned properties.

SECTION 3. That said streets and alleys hereby declared vacated.

SECTION 4. That vacating of said streets and alleys is subject to the granting of permanent easements for any existing public utilities.

SECTION 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
