STREETS: M/C Personnel hauled all the snow off the downtown area. Personnel plowed back snow/ice off the streets with the warm weather that was experienced. Personnel picked up Xmas trees from Central Park and around town. Personnel hauled away the mulch pile from the tub grinding at the WWTP.

WATER DISTRIBUTION: M/C Personnel shut off numerous water services, one being Casey's for construction purposes.

SEWER COLLECTION: M/C Personnel began loading manhole inspections onto Pipe Tech, where Fox can analyze further with the I/I, approximately 200 so far (half).

STORM SEWER COLLECTION: M/C Personnel cleaned numerous areas for draining purposes with the snow melt.

MECHANIC/SHOP: M/C Personnel serviced 303 (waxed), serviced diesel pump to get working and completed fuel report, also installed tank snakes in all three bulk tanks to help with water issues. Personnel also serviced FD tanker (valve pump), 104 (fuel tank and pump), PD 97 (rotate tires), 005 (engine miss, RR plugs and coil pack), 111 (engine fuel leak), 611 (repair hydro boost leak), K-9 unit (replace surge tank and battery and diagnosis engine lights), Park Dept truck and backhoes (greased) and trailer repairs.

OTHER: M/C Personnel attended a safety meeting on Slips/Trips & Falls and PPE. Personnel responded to 12 One Call Locates.

Please note that this report does not include every task M/C personnel performed, but shall be a highlight of our work performed as a department.

WWTP report February 2, 2016 Council Meeting

- After hour alarm and dog call outs –
 29th dog call, Safety Center reported dog to be picked up at 518 West Adams, 4:30 a.m., Delen
- Dept Head meetings I attended the meetings on the 19th & 26th.
- **Iowa Renewal Energy (IRE)** We plan to have a meeting with IRE, DNR, FOX, and the City on February 3, 2016 before IRE starts discharging to City again.
- Lexington lift station improvements WHR has been working at this lift station. WRH has installed the backup generator, the new control panels, automatic transfer switch, and performed some electrical work. The new pumps are scheduled for installation and startup on February 4, 2016.
- New NPDES discharge permit The new discharge permit was postponed and will take effect on March 1, 2016 instead of February 1, 2016. Iowa Renewal Energy (IRE) had requested less third party testing once they have some data points established to allow results from their in-house lab to be used for their monthly operating report instead of using a third party lab. The IDNR permit writer and Rob Baker from FOX worked together to get these changes made.
- WWTP Hach Dissolved Oxygen (DO) and Total Suspended Solids (TSS) SBR and Digester Meters – Andrew Palmer of Onsite Service Solutions (OSS) was here on January 28, 2016 to calibrate these meters. This calibration was required since data from these meters will be used for IDNR reporting. Andrew will send a written service & calibration report in near future.
- SASSO safety meeting Delen attended the safety meeting in Bonaparte on the 18th. The topics were Slips, Trips, and Falls & Personal Protective Equipment.
- 2015 annual bio-solids land application report We have been working on this annual report. This report is due to IDNR & USEPA by February 19, 2016.
- Explosion proof hanging room heater in OPS building pump room The heater had quit heating. We called Joe Marie to look at it. He thought the high limit switch wasn't working. Jason ordered the new switch on line. Joe got the new switch installed on the 25th.
- Truck #502 The original factory battery was replaced with new battery on the 19th. Zach also serviced (oil change & greased) this truck on the 28th.
- I/I meeting Delen attended the I/I meeting with City staff and Steve of FOX on the 19th. Delen has also been uploading I/I data at the M/C Dept so they can send it to FOX for analysis.
- Effluent sampler hose The suction hose on the effluent sampler was frozen in one spot and the heat tape melted through the hose in another spot. Jason spliced the hose back together. We installed the new heat tape & suction hose inside of foam pipe insulation pieces.
- IDNR Semi-Annual WWTP compliance review We had the following violations for the last six (6) months of 2015. A by-pass occurred at Lexington lift station on July 6, 2015. The by-pass at Lexington lift station was caused by heavy rain. Three (3) CBOD5 violations in October and November 2015. The CBOD5 violations were caused by IRE's discharge that entered the city collection system and then the WWTP.

- New NPDES discharge permit testing We plan to collect effluent samples on February 4, 2016 for the second round of the pollutant scan testing for the new NPDES discharge permit as required by IDNR.
- Annual bio-solids land application report for 2015 We have been working on this annual report for the USEPA & IDNR. The report is due by February 19, 2016.

Re: Various Possible Code Changes

We have a number of code changes that have been identified as needed by Merle or through our nuisance review committee processes. These changes are generally clarifications or of a relatively minor nature. However, we would like the Council to discuss and review these possible changes prior to drafting them into ordinance format for adoption and having formal consideration.

The changes suggested include the following:

- 1) Grass & Weeds (Chapter 52): Include volunteer trees as a nuisance. These are a common problem with nuisance properties.
- 2) Solid Waste (Chapter 105): Add definitions to better define and regulate dumpsters and portable storage units. Again, these are a very common nuisance issue.
- 3) Sidewalks (Chapter 136): Add language per Kevin to better shield the City from liability in sidewalk slip/fall cases based on recent court decisions.
- 4) Nuisance Abatement (Chapter 50): Correct code reference, since the previous Chapter 50.05 was changed in a previous code revision.
- 5) Building Numbering (Chapter 150): Change references from "City Engineer" to "Zoning Administrator", and increase building numbering size from 2 ½ inches to a more standard 4 inches.
- 6) Trees (Chapter 151): Add mulberry trees to the list of prohibited tree plantings.

Merle will be present at Tuesday's meeting to discuss and answer any questions.

52.01 WEEDS AND GRASS CONTROL. The maximum height of grass and/or weeds (such as jimson, burdock, ragweed, thistle, cocklebur or other plants of like kind) shall be eight (8) inches in developed residential, commercial and industrial zoned districts, twelve (12) inches in unplatted districts other than agricultural districts. The provisions of this chapter apply to all noxious weeds (as defined by the State of lowa Department of Agriculture) and all grass, weeds, non-ornamental brush, vines, volunteer trees, as defined in Chapter 151.12 and other dense and rank growth upon public or private property. The property owner and occupant are jointly and severally responsible for mowing the abutting space between the lot line and the curb line or edge of the traveled portion of the street right-of-way and one-half of any alley abutting the property. A lot may be exempted from the foregoing provision on the following conditions:

52.02 NUISANCE VIOLATION. A weed and grass control nuisance violation is created when:

- 1. All grass, weeds, non-ornamental brush, vines, volunteer trees as defined in Chapter 151.12, or other rank growth in excess of eight (8) inches exists on public or private property to the centerline of streets and alleys.
- 2. All grass, weeds, non-ornamental brush, vines or other rank growth in excess of twelve (12) inches exists on property that is platted as a lawful subdivision and/or is part of a planned development that has received approval from the City.
- 3. All grass, weeds, non-ornamental brush, vines or other rank growth in excess of eighteen (18) inches exists within twenty (20) feet of the exterior perimeter of property that is zoned for agricultural purposes and is used for the raising of crops, livestock, or other use as allowed by this Code of Ordinances.
- **52.03 NOTICE TO ABATE.** Upon discovery of any violations of this Chapter, the City may within forty-eight (48) hours initiate abatement procedures as outlined in Chapter 50 of this Code of Ordinances.

- 2. Storage of Containers. Residential solid waste containers and Portable Storage Containers shall be stored upon the residential premises. Commercial solid waste containers shall be stored on private property, unless the container owner has been granted written permission from the City to use public property for such purposes. The storage site shall be well drained: fully accessible to collection equipment, public health personnel and fire inspection personnel. All owners of residential and commercial premises shall be responsible for proper storage of all garbage, yard, and solid waste to prevent materials from leaving the premises except at collection.
- a. Dumpsters/containers next to roadway shall be provided with two pieces of reflective red and white tape two inches (2") in width and eighteen inches (18") in length (as a minimum) to be located at the top corners front and rear of the dumpster/container.
- b. Dumpsters/ containers placed on private property or the City's right-of-way shall bear the name and phone number of the owner of the dumpster/container, This identification shall be permanently affixed to two sides of the dumpster with letters no less than two inches (2") in height, in a color directly contrasting that of the dumpster.

136.04 RESPONSIBILITY FOR MAINTENANCE. It is the responsibility of the abutting property owners to maintain in a safe and hazard-free condition any sidewalk outside the lot and property lines and inside the curb lines or traveled portion of the public street. "The abutting property owner may be liable for damages caused by failure to maintain the sidewalk"

Re: Sale of 1307 North 2nd Avenue

As was alluded to at the last meeting, we are overdue in selling off the lot at 1307 North 2nd, which was the site of a nuisance house purchased and burned by the City. I had held off on this lot because I thought I had a buyer willing to purchase the lot for a very favorable price for construction of a home for low and moderate income (LMI) individuals. That has never come to pass, and it is definitely time just to bid out the lot and get a home constructed.

The bid guidelines attached generally follow the previously adopted Neighborhood Stabilization Program, adopted by the City Council in 2013. The major difference is that we are not strictly requiring an LMI buyer or occupant. I did build in a rebate of a portion of the lot price if the home does go to an LMI buyer. Also, I added some additional guidelines, such as having an attached garage, paved driveway, etc., to ensure that we get a quality home constructed on the lot. The minimum lot purchase price is \$5,000, which should be an attractive price for buyers, but provide enough money to repay us fully for all of our related costs, including demolition of the previous house.
